

No. 84. THE CUSTOMS LAWS, 1936 TO 1939.

NOTIFICATION UNDER SECTION 66.

It is hereby notified that by virtue of the powers vested in the Governor by section 66 of the Customs Laws, 1936 to 1939, and duly deputed to me, I hereby approve the premises described in the third column of the Schedule hereto, belonging to the person whose name is set out in the first column of that Schedule and occupied by the person whose name is set out in the second column of that Schedule, to be a private warehouse for the warehousing of the goods specified in the fourth column of the said Schedule without payment of import duties upon the first entry of such goods therein.

GENERAL LICENCE MADE UNDER SECTION 3 AND AUTHORIZING THE
PAYMENT OF FREIGHTS BY THE CYPRUS CHAMBER OF COMMERCE
ACTING ON BEHALF OF OWNERS OF CARGOES.

In exercise of the powers vested in him by section 3 of the Trading with the Enemy Law, 1939, and of all other powers enabling him in that behalf, His Excellency the Governor has been pleased to authorize and does hereby authorize the Cyprus Chamber of Commerce to pay freight and other necessary charges to or for the benefit of any enemy on behalf of the owner of any cargo in a ship lying at a port in any country not being enemy territory, for the purpose of obtaining possession of that cargo.
