THE MUNICIPAL CORPORATIONS LAWS, 1930 TO 1938.

ORDER IN COUNCIL No. 1928

MADE UNDER SECTION 78.

W. D. BATTERSHILL, Governor.

Whereas at a meeting of the Council of the Municipal Corporation of Nicosia (hereinafter called "the Municipal Council") held on the 20th October, 1938, it was decided upon a resolution of the required majority to sell the areas of immovable property set out in Part I of the Schedule hereto and to set aside as a street the area set out in Part II of such Schedule (all such areas being property registered in the name of the Municipal Corporation).

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, in exercise of the powers vested in him by section 78 of the Municipal Corporations Laws, 1930 to 1938, and with the advice of the Executive Council, is pleased to sanction and hereby sanctions the sale and the setting aside as a street of the areas of the immovable property as hereinbefore mentioned:

Provided that the sale price of the areas of immovable property set out in Part I of the Schedule hereto shall not be less than £250.

SCHEDULE.

PART I.

Description of Property to be sold.

(a) All that area being part of plot No. 6 of Block 12, Top-khané Quarter, Nicosia, registered in the name of the Municipal Corporation of Nicosia under Registration No. 4 dated 20th July, 1931, comprising 2,664 square feet approximately as shewn hatched in red (a) on the Government Survey Plan filed in D.L.R.S. M.P. 598/39.

(b) All that area being part of plot No. 6/1 of Block 12, Top-khané Quarter, Nicosia, registered in the name of the Municipal Corporation of Nicosia under Registration No. 5 dated 20th July, 1931, comprising 1,552 square feet, approximately, as shewn hatched in red (b) on the Government Survey Plan filed in D.L.R.S. M.P. 598/39.

PART II.

Description of Property to be set aside as a Street.

All that area being parts of plots Nos. 6 and 6/1 of Block 12, Top-khané Quarter, Nicosia, registered in the name of the Municipal

Corporation of Nicosia under Registration Nos. 4 and 5, dated 20th July, 1931, comprising 2,096 square feet approximately, as shewn hatched in yellow (c) on the Government Survey Plan filed in D.L.R.S. M.P. 598/39.

THE CUSTOMS LAWS, 1936 TO 1939.

ORDER IN COUNCIL No. 1929

MADE UNDER SECTION 59.

W. D. BATTERSHILL.

Governor.

In exercise of the powers vested in him by section 59 of the Customs Laws, 1936 to 1939, His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, has been pleased to order and it is hereby ordered as follows:-

1. This Order may be cited as the Prohibited Exports (Essential Goods) Order, 1940.

2. The exportation from the Colony—

(a) of the goods specified in the First Schedule hereto to all destinations;

(b) of the goods specified in the Second Schedule hereto to all destinations other than British ports and ports in Palestine and Egypt,

is prohibited save under a licence granted by the Governor and subject to such terms and conditions as may be specified in such licence.

3. The Prohibited Exports (Essential Goods) Orders, 1939 to 1940, are hereby revoked.
