# THE CUSTOMS LAWS, 1936 TO 1939.

## ORDER IN COUNCIL No. 1931

MADE UNDER SECTION 52.

W. D. BATTERSHILL,

Governor.

In exercise of the powers vested in him by section 52 of the Customs Laws, 1936 to 1939, His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, has been pleased to order and it is hereby ordered as follows:—

1. This Order may be cited as the Import Duty (Cotton Seed Cake)

Exemption Order, 1940.

2. From and after the 13th March, 1940, cotton seed cake with regard to which the Director of Agriculture is satisfied that it is imported into the Colony by an owner of a factory for the purpose of being used for the preparation of food for animals in a compound form for export from the Colony in such compound form, shall be admitted into the Colony free from all import duties:

Provided that the importer shall sign a declaration in the form in

the Schedule hereto.

1. I have imported the cotton seed aforesaid solely for the purpose of using the same for the preparation of food for animals in a compound form for export from the Colony in such compound form.

2. I shall not sell or otherwise dispose of any cotton seed cake as aforesaid but shall only use the same for the purpose aforesaid in the factory aforesaid.

- 3. If I fail to observe the provisions of paragraph 1 or 2 hereof I shall pay to the Comptroller the full import duty for the time being in force for any such cotton seed cake imported as aforesaid without prejudice to any other proceedings which may be taken against me for failure to observe the provision of any of the paragraphs as aforesaid.
- 4. I agree that the Comptroller or any person authorized by him in that behalf shall at all times have the power and right to enter the factory aforesaid and any premises whereon or wherein any cotton seed cake as aforesaid is kept, for the purpose of inspecting such factory and premises and ensuring that the terms of this declaration are complied with.
