SUBSIDIARY LEGISLATION.

No. 106. THE DEFENCE REGULATIONS, 1940 TO (No. 1) 1941.

ORDER MADE UNDER REGULATION 21 (1).

I, the Governor, in exercise of the powers conferred by regulation 21 (1) of the Defence Regulations, 1940 to (No. 1) 1941, do hereby order as follows:—

1. This Order may be cited as the Photography Exemption Order, 1941.

2. All persons in the Colony, other than enemy aliens, are hereby exempted from the provisions of regulation 21 (1) of the Defence Regulations, 1940 to (No. 1) 1941:

Provided that no person shall, save with a written permit granted by the Competent Authority, have a camera in his possession, or take any photograph, make any sketch, plan or other representation of any place, matter or thing situated in—

- (a) any area specified as a prohibited area under the provisions of regulation 70 of the Defence Regulations, 1940 to (No. 1) 1941; and
- (b) the area specified in the Schedule hereto.

3. The Order dated the 18th June, 1940, published under Notification No. 241 in Supplement No. 3 to the *Gazette* of the 19th June, 1940, is hereby revoked.

SCHEDULE.

Commencing at a point on the edge of the sea due east of the termination of the asphalted road at the King George Hotel, locality Phaleron, Varosha; thence westerly following the northern edge of the said asphalted road south-westwards to the P. O. Pillar Box near the Gymnasium; thence north-westwards along the easterly side of the road on the west of the Athletic Ground of the Gymnasium to the junction of this road with the road to the Old Slaughter House; thence south-westwards along the north boundary of this road (crossing the road from the Municipal Market to the Harbour) to the asphalted road to the Savoy Hotel; thence along the north boundary of this road to the road junction at the Savoy Hotel; thence along the easterly boundary of the main road passing the Government Offices, Station, and Hospital to the road junction at the Land Gate; thence following the easterly side of the Famagusta-Karpass road to Mile Post 4; thence due east to the seashore; thence out to sea in the same direction for a distance of two miles; thence south-easterly in a straight line to a point in the sea two miles due east of the Island Nisi-ton-Maymounion; thence south-eastwards in a straight line to a point in the sea two miles due east of the starting point; thence due west a distance of two miles to the starting point.
