SUBSIDIARY LEGISLATION.

**No. 115. BY THE GOVERNOR,
A PROCLAMATION.**

W. D. BATTERSHILL,

In exercise of the powers vested in me by section 9 of the Income Tax Law, 1941, I, William Denis Battershill, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Cyprus, do hereby order and proclaim as follows :—

The interest payable on the loans set out in the Schedule hereto, charged on the public revenue of the Colony, shall be exempt from income tax in respect of interest payable to persons not resident in the Colony.

No. 116. THE BURIALS LAWS, 1896 AND 1937.

No. 117. THE CUSTOMS LAWS, 1936 TO 1940.

NOTIFICATION UNDER SECTION 66.

NOTICE No. 29 UNDER CLAUSE 13.

A.—The Schedule is hereby amended by the deletion therefrom of Part 7 and the substitution thereof of the following part :—

“ PART 7.—RICE.

Type of Rice.	Retail Price.	Wholesale Price.
Egyptian rice ‘Mamsuh’	5 piastres per oke.	37 shillings 3 piastres per bag of approximately 80 okes.
Rizzoni and all other types of rice.	5½ piastres per oke.	41 shillings 6 piastres per bag of approximately 80 okes.

In this Part of this Schedule—

the term ‘wholesale’ means sale or purchase of rice in quantities of not less than one bag of approximately 80 okes at any one time or at any single transaction.”

B.—The Schedule is hereby amended by the addition to Part 18 of the following :—
