

E.—The Schedule is hereby amended by the deletion therefrom of Part 35 and the substitution therefor of the following part :—

“PART 35.—EDIBLE COCONUT OIL.

In this Part of the Schedule—

- (a) the term ‘edible coconut oil’ does not include coconut oil which is sold in new sealed tins of 2 okes or less, each of which is marked with a brand name.
- (b) the term ‘wholesale’ means—
- (i) in respect of ordinary edible coconut oil and of deodorized edible coconut oil in drums, sale or purchase thereof in quantities in excess of 10 okes at any one time or at any single transaction.
- (ii) in respect of deodorized edible coconut oil in new sealed tins of 3 to 14 okes, sale or purchase thereof in quantities of not less than one tin of 3 to 14 okes at any one time or at any single transaction.”

2. In plain villages except in the villages of Lapithos, Karavas and Kazaphani	135 ” ”

4. In all villages, when purchased in towns in quantities of not less than one bag of 50 okes in respect of which a receipt has been given by the municipal weigher of the Municipality where the purchase has been made ..	155 ” ”
5. In towns, when purchased in other towns in quantities of not less than one bag of 50 okes in respect of which a receipt has been given by the municipal weigher of the Municipality where the purchase has been made ..	155 ” ”

Definition: ‘Whole wheat flour’ shall have the same meaning as in the Defence (Sale of Barley Flour and Wheat Flour) Order, 1940.

Condition: Any person selling at the prices shown under paragraphs 4 and 5 shall keep on his premises a register showing the quantity of each purchase, the date and the person from whom the flour was purchased.”
