REGULATIONS MADE UNDER SECTION 9.

I, the Governor in Council, in exercise of the powers conferred by section 9 of the Petroleum Law, 1939, do hereby make the following regulations :---

1. These regulations may be cited as the Petroleum (Amendment) Regulations, 1941, and shall be read as one with the Petroleum Regulations, 1940 to (No. 1) 1940, (hereinafter referred to as "the principal Regulations"), and the principal Regulations and these regulations may together be cited as the Petroleum Regulations, 1940 to 1941.

"Provided that vessels fitted with gas ejectors and gas tight hatches may remain alongside the pier or wharf, in which case neither wire ropes nor anchors shall be used as moorings."

Delegation of Power under Paragraph (5) of Regulation 66.
