No. 149. **THE CUSTOMS LAWS, 1936 TO (No. 3) 1940.**

ORDER IN COUNCIL No. 2014

MADE UNDER SECTION 52.

I, the Governor in Council, in exercise of the powers conferred by section 52 of the Customs Laws, 1936 to (No. 3) 1940, do hereby order as follows:—

1. This Order may be cited as the Import Duty (Red Cross Stores) Exemption Order, 1941, and shall be deemed to have come into operation on the first day of May, 1941.

2. All stores and appliances imported into the Colony by or on behalf of the British Red Cross Society and Order of St. John of Jerusalem and certified by the Deputy Commissioner for Cyprus that they shall be used solely for the purposes and in connection with the activities in Cyprus of the said Society and Order, shall be admitted into the Colony free from all import duties.

**THE EMERGENCY POWERS (CYPRUS DEFENCE) (ARRIVAL
AND DEPARTURE) REGULATIONS, 1939.**

ORDER MADE UNDER REGULATION 2.

I, the Governor, in exercise of the powers conferred by regulation 2 of the Emergency Powers (Cyprus Defence) (Arrival and Departure) Regulations, 1939, do hereby order as follows:—

1. This Order may be cited as the Defence (Restrictions on Departures from the Colony) (Amendment) Order, 1941, and shall be read as one with the Defence (Restrictions on Departures from the Colony) Order, 1939, (hereinafter referred to as "the principal Order"), and the principal Order and this Order may together be cited as the Defence (Restrictions on Departures from the Colony) Orders, 1939 and 1941.

2. Clause 3 of the principal Order is hereby revoked.
