THE CYPRUS VOLUNTEER FORCE LAWS, 1940 AND 1941.

PROCLAMATION MADE UNDER SECTION 11A.

W. D. BATTERSHILL,

Governor.

Whereas by section 11a of the Cyprus Volunteer Force Laws, 1940 and 1941, it is enacted that the Governor may, by Proclamation, call out and mobilize the Force or any part thereof for actual service whenever it appears advisable to do so by reason of the existence of a state of war or of the apprehension of war or by reason of any internal emergency threatening the security of life or property:

And whereas it appears to me advisable by reason of the existence of a state of war to call out and mobilize the whole of the Force :

Now, therefore, I, Sir William Denis Battershill, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Cyprus, in exercise of the powers vested in me by section 11a of the said Cyprus Volunteer Force Laws, 1940 and 1941, and of every other power hereunto enabling do hereby, by this Proclamation, call out and mobilize the whole of the Cyprus Volunteer Force.

This Proclamation shall be deemed to have been made and to have had effect as from the 2nd day of June, 1941.

Given under my hand and the Public Seal of the Colony at Nicosia, this 2nd day of July, 1941.

THE DEFENCE REGULATIONS, 1940 TO (No. 3) 1941.

ORDER MADE UNDER REGULATION 2.

- I, the Governor, in exercise of the powers conferred by regulation 2 of the Defence Regulations, 1940 to (No. 3) 1941, do hereby order as follows:—
- 1. This Order may be cited as the Defence (Essential Services) Order, 1941, and shall come into operation on and from the date of its publication in the Gazette.
- 2. The following service is declared to be of public utility or to be essential for the prosecution of the war or essential to the life of the community, that is to say—

The Cyprus Government Railway.
