The Quarantine Law, 1932.

NOTIFICATION UNDER SECTION 4.

In exercise of the powers vested in him by section 4 of the Quarantine Law, 1932, or otherwise, His Excellency the Governor is pleased to declare and it is hereby declared that the local areas in the first column of the Schedule hereto are infected local areas and that all passengers and goods therefrom shall, as from the date hereof, be subject to the measures prescribed by the Quarantine Regulations, 1932 to 1936, with respect to the dangerous infectious diseases in the second column of the Schedule hereto.

The Notification No. 96, published in Supplement No. 3 to the *Gazette* of the 30th April, 1941, is hereby cancelled.

No. 178. THE DEFENCE REGULATIONS, 1940 TO (No. 3) 1941.

ORDER MADE BY THE COMPETENT AUTHORITY UNDER REGULATION 61.

In exercise of the powers vested in me by virtue of my appointment by the Governor as the Competent Authority for the purposes of regulation 61 of the Defence Regulations, 1940 to (No. 3) 1941, I hereby order as follows:—

1. This Order may be cited as the Defence (Controlled Goods) Order, 1941.

2. For the purposes of this Order—

“controlled goods” means any goods which appear in the First Schedule to this Order and shall include any goods which appear in any Notice amending such Schedule.

3. Within three days from the date of publication of this Order and, in the case of an amendment to the First Schedule hereto made under the provisions of clause 5, within three days from the date of the publication of the Notice amending such Schedule, every person who has in his possession or under his control any controlled goods in excess of any quantity which appears in the said Schedule or in any amendment thereto shall complete and deliver to me a return in the form set forth in the Second Schedule hereto in respect of the controlled goods in his possession or under his control.

4.—(1) From and after the date of the publication of this Order or of the publication of any amendment to the First Schedule hereto no person shall withdraw any controlled goods from the Customs save under a special permit issued under my hand.

(2) Every special permit issued under the provisions of paragraph (1) hereof may contain such terms and conditions (including the price at which such controlled goods are to be sold or purchased) as may be specified therein.

5. The First Schedule hereto may be amended by me by Notice published in the *Gazette* and upon such publication such amendment shall form part of the Order for all purposes.

6. Any person who—

(a) acts in contravention of any of the provisions of this Order or of any of the terms and conditions specified in any permit issued under this Order; or

(b) makes under clause 3 of this Order any return which is false in any material particular,

is liable to the penalties prescribed in regulation 94 of the Defence Regulations, 1940 to (No. 3) 1941.

No. 179. THE DEFENCE REGULATIONS, 1940 TO (No. 3) 1941.

ORDER MADE BY THE COMPETENT AUTHORITY UNDER REGULATION 61.

In exercise of the powers vested in me by virtue of my appointment by the Governor as the Competent Authority for the purposes of regulation 61 of the Defence Regulations, 1940 to (No. 3) 1941, I hereby order as follows :—

1. This Order may be cited at the Defence (Cyprus Grown Wheat Control) Amendment Order, 1941, and shall be read as one with the Defence (Cyprus Grown Wheat Control) Order, 1941, hereinafter called the "principal Order", and the principal Order and this Order may together be cited as the Defence (Cyprus Grown Wheat Control) Orders, 1941.

"(d) treat or permit to be treated any wheat in such a manner as to render it unsuitable for use as seed."
