THE DEFENCE (CONTROL OF SALE PRICES OF SCHEDULED ARTICLES) CONSOLIDATION ORDERS, 1940.

NOTICE No. 37 UNDER CLAUSE 13.

A.—The Schedule is hereby amended by the deletion therefrom of Part 7 and the substitution therefor of the following part :—

“PART 7.—RICE.

(1)	(2)	(3)
Type of Rice.	Retail Price.	Wholesale Price.
Egyptian rice ‘Mamsuh’	5 piastres per oke.	39 shillings per bag of approximately 80 okes.
Rizzoni and all other types of rice.	5½ piastres per oke.	42 shillings 5 piastres per bag of approximately 80 okes.

In this Part of the Schedule—

the term ‘wholesale’ means sale or purchase of rice in quantities of not less than one bag of approximately 80 okes at any one time or at any single transaction.”

B.—The Schedule is hereby amended by the deletion therefrom of Part 26 and the substitution therefor of the following part :—

“PART 26.—WHOLE WHEAT FLOUR.

(1)	(2)
All towns and villages	150 paras per oke.

Definition : ‘Whole wheat flour’ shall have the same meaning as in the Defence (Sale of Barley Flour and Wheat Flour) Order, 1940.

Modification : Where whole wheat flour is sold in any village there may be added to the maximum price of 150 paras per oke, 2 paras per oke for every 10 miles or part thereof by which such village is distant from the principal town of the District in which such village is situated : Provided that in no case such addition shall exceed 10 paras per oke.”

C.—The Schedule is hereby amended by the deletion therefrom of Part 33 and the substitution therefor of the following part :—

“PART 33.—COTTON SEED OIL.

(1)	(2)	(3)
Type of Cotton Seed Oil.	Retail Price.	Wholesale Price.
All types	31 piastres per litre.	28 piastres per litre.

In this Part of the Schedule—

(a) the term ‘Cotton Seed Oil’ does not include cotton seed oil which is sold in new sealed tins of 2 okes or less, each of which is marked with a brand name ;

(b) the term ‘wholesale’ means sale or purchase of cotton seed oil in quantities in excess of 5 litres at any one time or at any single transaction.”

THE DEFENCE REGULATIONS, 1940 TO (No. 3) 1941.

ORDER MADE BY THE COMPETENT AUTHORITY UNDER REGULATION 61.

In exercise of the powers vested in me by virtue of my appointment by the Governor as the Competent Authority for the purposes of regulation 61 of the Defence Regulations, 1940 to (No. 3) 1941, I hereby order as follows :—

1. This Order may be cited as the Defence (Potatoes Grown from Irish Seed) (Restriction) Order, 1941.

2. In this Order—

“potatoes” mean potatoes produced from imported Irish seed issued on loan by the Agricultural Department during April and May, 1941.

3. On and from the date of publication of this Order no person shall, save under a written permit issued by the Director of Agriculture or by any other person authorized by the Director of Agriculture in that behalf,

- (a) remove or permit to be removed from any premises any potatoes;
- (b) purchase, sell, consume, treat in any way or otherwise dispose of any potatoes.

4. Any person who acts in contravention of any of the provisions of this Order is liable to the penalties prescribed in regulation 94 of the Defence Regulations, 1940 to (No. 3) 1941.

THE DEFENCE REGULATIONS, 1940 TO (No. 3) 1941.

ORDER MADE BY THE COMPETENT AUTHORITY UNDER REGULATION 61.

In exercise of the powers vested in me by virtue of my appointment by the Governor as the Competent Authority for the purposes of regulation 61 of the Defence Regulations, 1940 to (No. 3) 1941, I hereby order as follows :—

1. This Order may be cited as the Defence (Returns of Stocks of Potatoes) Order, 1941.

2. On or before the 27th July, 1941, every person who has in his possession or under his control any quantity of potatoes in excess of 100 okes shall complete and deliver—

- (a) in the case of a person who is a member of a Co-operative Society to the Secretary of the Co-operative Society of which he is a member,
- (b) in the case of a person who is not a member of the Co-operative Society to the Mukhtar of the village or quarter in which he resides,

a return, in the form set forth in the First Schedule hereto in respect of the total quantity of potatoes in his possession or under his control.

3. On or before the 31st July, 1941, all Mukhtars and all Secretaries of Co-operative Societies to whom such returns have been delivered shall complete and deliver to me at Nicosia a return in the form set forth in the Second Schedule hereto.

4. Every person shall permit such person as I, or the Commissioner of the District, may authorize in writing in that behalf and any Mukhtar and any Secretary of a Co-operative Society to enter upon and inspect his premises for the purpose of ascertaining whether the provisions of this Order have been, or are being complied with, or for the purpose of checking the correctness or accuracy of any return made by such person under clause 2 of this Order.

5. Any person who—

- (a) acts in contravention of, or fails to comply with any of the provisions of this Order; or
- (b) makes under clause 2 or 3 of this Order a return which is false in any material particular,

shall be liable to the penalties prescribed in regulation 94 of the Defence Regulations, 1940 to (No. 3) 1941.
