THE EMERGENCY POWERS (DEFENCE) ACTS, 1939 AND 1940.

REGULATIONS MADE BY THE GOVERNOR.

W. D. Battershill, Governor,

I, the Governor, in exercise of the powers conferred by the Emergency Powers (Defence) Acts, 1939 and 1940, as extended to the Colony by the Emergency Powers (Colonial Defence) Order in Council, 1939, and the Emergency Powers (Colonial Defence) (Amendment) Order in Council, 1940, do hereby make the following regulations:—

1. These regulations may be cited as the Emergency Powers (Cyprus Defence) (Finance) Amendment Regulations, 1941, and shall be read as one with the Emergency Powers (Cyprus Defence) (Finance) Regulations, 1940 to (No. 1) 1940 (hereinafter referred to as "the principal Regulations"), and the principal Regulations and these regulations may together be cited as the Emergency Powers (Cyprus Defence) (Finance) Regulations, 1940 to 1941, and shall come into operation on the 26th day of July, 1941.

2. The definition of the term "security" in regulation 2 of the principal Regulations shall be substituted with the following definition:—

"' security', except in so far as is otherwise expressly provided—

(a) includes shares, stock, bonds, notes, debentures, debenture stock and Treasury bills,

(b) does not include a bill of exchange, a promissory note or a deposit receipt."

3. The following regulation shall be inserted in the principal Regulations immediately after regulation 4 thereof as regulation 4A:—

"Power of Treasurer to prohibit action on certain orders as to gold, etc.

4a. Where the Treasurer is satisfied that owing to changes in the external or internal position of any State action is being, or is likely to be, taken to the detriment of the economic position of the Colony or otherwise to the prejudice of the efficient prosecution of the war, the Treasurer may give general or special directions prohibiting, either absolutely or to such extent as may be specified in the directions, the carrying out, excepting with permission granted by or on behalf of the Treasurer, of any orders given by or on behalf of—

(a) the state or the sovereign thereof or any persons resident therein, or

(b) any body corporate which is incorporated under the laws of that state or is under the control of that state or the sovereign thereof or any person resident therein,

in so far as the order-

 requires the person to whom the order is given to make any payment or to part with any gold or securities; or

(ii) requires any change to be made in the person to whose credit any sum is to stand or to whose order any gold or securities are to be held.
