THE EMERGENCY POWERS (DEFENCE) ACTS, 1939 AND 1940.

REGULATIONS MADE BY THE GOVERNOR UNDER SECTION 1.

I, the Governor, in exercise of the powers conferred by the Emergency Powers (Defence) Acts, 1939 and 1940, as extended to the Colony by the Emergency Powers (Colonial Defence) Order in Council, 1939, and the Emergency Powers (Colonial Defence) (Amendment) Order in Council, 1940, do hereby make the following regulations:—

1. These regulations may be cited as the Fines and Penalties Recovery Law (Amendment) Regulations, 1941.

2. During the continuance in force of these regulations, section 2 of the Fines and Penalties Recovery Law, 1883, and the marginal note thereto shall be substituted by the following section and marginal note:—

“Penalty, when to be paid. 2. Any penalty ordered to be paid may be ordered to be paid forthwith or at such subsequent time or by such instalments, as the Court making the order may think fit.”

THE DEFENCE REGULATIONS, 1940 TO (No. 3) 1941.

ORDER MADE BY THE COMPETENT AUTHORITY UNDER REGULATION 61.

In exercise of the powers vested in me by virtue of my appointment by the Governor as the Competent Authority for the purposes of regulation 61 of the Defence Regulations, 1940 to (No. 3) 1941, I hereby order as follows:—

1. This Order may be cited as the Defence (Returns of Stocks of Locally Manufactured Soap) Order, 1941.

2. Within three days from the date of publication of this Order, every person who has in his possession or under his control any quantity of locally manufactured soap in excess of 30 okes shall complete and deliver to me a return in the form set forth in the Schedule hereto, in respect of the total quantity of soap in his possession or under his control.

3. Every person shall permit such person as I, or the Commissioner of the District, may authorize, by writing in that behalf, to enter upon and inspect his premises for the purpose of ascertaining whether the provisions of this Order have been, or are being, complied with, or for the purpose of checking the correctness or accuracy of any return made by such person under clause 2 of this Order.
