THE TRADING WITH THE ENEMY LAWS, 1939 TO 1941.

ORDER MADE UNDER SECTION 2 (1).

I, the Governor, in exercise of the powers conferred by section 2 (1) of the Trading with the Enemy Laws, 1939 to 1941, and of every other power hereunto enabling, do hereby revoke with effect as from the 21st of August, 1941, the Order published in Supplement No. 3 to the *Gazette* of the 4th June, 1941, under Notification No. 127, relating to the Republic of Syria and the Lebanon under French Mandate.

AUTHORIZATION BY THE GOVERNOR UNDER SECTION 3.

I, the Governor, in exercise of the powers conferred by section 3 of the Trading with the Enemy Laws, 1939 to 1941, do hereby authorize any person to trade with any body of persons (whether corporate or unincorporate) carrying on business in any of those territories formerly known as Italian East Africa, now in the occupation of His Majesty.

THE ELEMENTARY EDUCATION LAWS, 1933 TO (No. 2) 1937.

Notice under Section 74 (1).

In exercise of the powers vested in him by section 74 (1) of the Elementary Education Laws, 1933 to (No. 2) 1937, His Excellency the Governor is pleased to direct and it is hereby directed that the tax mentioned in section 65 of the said Laws payable by the Maronite tax payers of the villages mentioned in the first column of the Schedule hereto shall be increased by the rate per thousand mentioned in the second column of the said Schedule hereto to provide the amount required for the payment of loans or annual maintenance of the Maronite schools of the said villages respectively.

In this Part of the Schedule-

(a) the term 'edible coconut oil' does not include coconut oil which is sold in new sealed tins of 2 okes or less, each of which is marked with a brand

(b) the term 'wholesale' means-

(i) in respect of ordinary edible coconut oil and of deodorized edible coconut oil in drums, sale or purchase thereof in quantities in excess of 10 okes at any one time or at any single transaction.

(ii) in respect of deodorized edible coconut oil in new sealed tins of 3 to 14 okes, sale or purchase thereof in quantities of not less than one tin of 3 to 14 okes at any one time or at any single transaction.

C.—The Schedule is hereby amended by the addition thereto of the following

"PART 36.—POTATOES.

Potatoes	$4\frac{1}{2}$ piastres per oke	3 piastres and 30 paras per oke.

Limitation: All persons having in their possession or under their control more than 200 okes of potatoes shall sell only at wholesale prices. In this part of the Schedule-

the term 'wholesale' means sale or purchase of potatoes in quantities of not less than 40 okes at any one time or at any single transaction."
