I, the Acting Governor in Council, in exercise of the powers conferred on the Governor by section 52 of the Customs Laws, 1936 to 1941, do hereby order as follows:—

1. This Order may be cited as the Import Duty (Flour) Exemption Order, 1941.
2. From and after the 13th day of September, 1941, all flour of wheat, rye or maize imported into the Colony shall be admitted into the Colony free from all import duties.

**THE DEFENCE (CONTROL OF SALE PRICES OF SCHEDULED ARTICLES)**  
**CONSOLIDATION ORDERS, 1940.**

NOTICE No. 44 UNDER CLAUSE 13.

This Notice shall come into effect on the 13th day of September, 1941.

A.—The Schedule is hereby amended by the deletion therefrom of Part 3 and the substitution therefor of the following part:—

“PART 3.—IMPORTED FLOUR.

	Retail Price	Wholesale Price
Imported flour ..	6 piastres and 10 paras per oke.	£1. 14s. per bag of approximately 53 okes.

In this Part of the Schedule—  
the term ‘wholesale’ means sale or purchase of imported flour in quantities of not less than one bag of approximately 53 okes at any one time or at any single transaction.”
