

3. Part XIII of the First Schedule to the principal Regulations (under heading "Special Rates and Fares for His Majesty's Forces") is hereby amended by the deletion in paragraph (3) thereof of the figures "£5" and the substitution thereof of the figures "£10".

4. A surcharge as hereinafter shall be made on all fares, rates, charges or fees set out in the First and Second Schedules to the principal Regulations as amended by these regulations, that is to say :—

(a) a surcharge of 25 per centum, in respect of passengers traffic ;

(b) a surcharge of 15 per centum, in respect of goods and parcels traffic :

Provided that the minimum surcharge shall be 20 paras in each case.

5. Regulation 5 of the Railway (Amendment) Regulations, 1941, is hereby revoked.

THE ADVOCATES LAWS, 1933 TO 1940.

AUTHORIZATION UNDER SECTION 12 (1).

I, the Attorney-General, in exercise of the powers conferred by section 12 (1) of the Advocates Laws, 1933 to 1940, do hereby authorize all District Medical Officers and Medical Officers, the Chief Sanitary Inspector and all District Health Inspectors to appear, plead and act in any proceedings under the following Laws and any subsidiary legislation made thereunder :—

(a) The Public Health Anti-Malaria Law, 1924.

(b) The Cyprus Criminal Code, 1928 to 1937, so far as it relates to sections 180 to 183, both inclusive.

(c) The Quarantine Law, 1932.

(d) The Public Health (Villages) Laws, 1936 to 1939.

(e) The Sale of Food and Drugs Law, 1938.

(f) Any Order, Notification or Regulations made under the Disease Prevention Law, 1883.

(g) The Defence (Public Health) Regulations, 1941.

2. The authorizations given under Notifications Nos. 380 and 415, published in the *Gazettes* of the 29th March, 1934, and the 13th April, 1934, respectively, are hereby revoked.

In this Part of the Schedule—

- (a) the term ‘Cotton Seed Oil’ does not include cotton seed oil which is sold in new sealed tins of 2 okes or less, each of which is marked with a brand name;
- (b) the term ‘wholesale’ means sale or purchase of cotton seed oil in quantities in excess of 5 litres at any one time or at any single transaction.”
