THE DEFENCE (CONTROL OF SALE PRICES OF SCHEDULED ARTICLES) CONSOLIDATION ORDERS, 1940 AND 1941.

NOTICE No. 53 UNDER CLAUSE 13.

The Schedule is hereby amended by the deletion therefrom of Part 21 and the substitution therefor of the following part :—

“ PART 21.—CORDWOOD.

In this Part of the Schedule—

the term ‘ cordwood ’ means firewood of a size exceeding 3 feet in width or in length, weighed and delivered at the premises of the purchaser within a radius of 2 miles from the office of the Commissioner in each of the towns specified in column 1 :

Provided that—

- (a) where cordwood is cut by hand by the supplier at the premises of the purchaser into sizes not exceeding 18 inches in length an additional charge not exceeding 1½ paras per oke may be made for cutting, and
- (b) where cordwood is delivered cut by a machine-driven saw into sizes not exceeding 18 inches in length, an additional charge not exceeding 3 paras per oke may be made for cutting.”
