THE SUMMER TIME LAW, 1940.

ORDER MADE UNDER SECTION 2.

I, the Governor, in exercise of the powers conferred by section 2 of the Summer Time Law, 1940, do hereby order as follows :—

1. This Order may be cited as the Summer Time Order, 1941.
2. In the period specified in the Schedule hereto the time for legal and general purposes in the Colony shall be three hours in advance of Greenwich Mean Time.

SCHEDULE.

From midnight (Greenwich Mean Time) on the 23rd March, 1941, to midnight (Greenwich Mean Time) on the 31st October, 1941.

THE MUNICIPAL CORPORATIONS LAWS, 1930 TO 1941.

BYE-LAWS MADE BY THE COUNCIL OF THE MUNICIPAL CORPORATION
OF FAMAGUSTA.

In exercise of the powers vested in them by the Municipal Corporations Laws, 1930 to 1941, and otherwise, the Council of the Municipal Corporation of Famagusta hereby make the following Bye-laws :—

1. These Bye-laws may be cited as the Famagusta Municipal (Amendment) Bye-laws, 1941, and shall be read as one with the Famagusta Municipal (Principal and Amended) Bye-laws, 1940, (hereinafter referred to as “ the principal Bye-laws ”), and the principal Bye-laws and these Bye-laws may together be cited as the Famagusta Municipal Bye-laws, 1940 to 1941.

2. Bye-laws 215, 216, 217, 218 and 219 of the principal Bye-laws are hereby revoked without prejudice to anything done or left undone thereunder.

The above Bye-laws have been approved by His Excellency the Governor.
