SUBSIDIARY LEGISLATION.

No. 61. THE ADULTERATION OF PRODUCE LAWS, 1926 TO 1935.

REGULATIONS MADE UNDER SECTION 10.

I, the Governor in Council, in exercise of the powers conferred by section 10 of the Adulteration of Produce Laws, 1926 to 1935, do hereby make the following regulations:—

1. These regulations may be cited as the Adulteration of Produce (Local Sales) Amendment Regulations, 1941, and shall be read as one with the Adulteration of Produce (Local Sales) Regulations, 1940, (hereinafter referred to as "the principal Regulations"), and the principal Regulations and these regulations may together be cited as the Adulteration of Produce (Local Sales) Regulations, 1940 and 1941.

2. Clause 2 of the principal Regulations is hereby amended by the addition thereto of the following proviso:—

"Provided that in the case of wheat, out of the total maximum percentage of foreign ingredients or extraneous matters set out in the second column of the Schedule hereto, the percentage of darnel (commonly known as *koundoura*) shall in no case exceed one per centum."

No. 62. THE VILLAGE AUTHORITIES LAWS, 1931 TO (No. 2) 1937.

SPECIAL AUTHORIZATION UNDER SECTION 13A (1).
