 This Order may be cited as the Defence (Raisin and Carob Bread) Order, 1942.
 For the purposes of this Order—

 "bread" means bread of any size, shape or kind and includes cakes and biscuits and what are commonly known as *Soullouria* or *paximadia*.
 "carob meal" means meal from kibbled carobs of such fineness that not less than 80 per cent. of such meal will pass through a sieve of 30 meshes to the linear inch.

3. From and after the 20th April, 1942, no person shall bake for his own use or for sale, or shall sell, offer for sale, or expose for sale, any bread, except bread containing either

(a) a quantity of raisins not less than ten per cent. of the whole weight of bread, or

(b) a quantity of carob meal not less than ten per cent. of the whole weight of bread.

4. Every person shall permit such person as I, or the Commissioner of the District, may authorize in writing in that behalf, to enter upon and inspect his premises for the purpose of ascertaining whether the provisions of this Order have been or are being complied with.

5. Any bread baked, sold, offered for sale, or exposed for sale in contravention of any of the provisions of this Order may be seized by such person as I, or the Commissioner of the District in which such bread is found, may authorize in writing in that behalf, and may be disposed of in such manner as I or the said Commissioner, as the case may be, may direct, without prejudice to any proceedings which may be taken for any such contravention.

6. Any person who acts in contravention of the provisions of this Order is liable to the penalties prescribed in regulation 94 of the Defence Regulations, 1940 to (No. 3) 1942.

7. Nothing in this Order shall affect the validity of the Defence (Registration Gazettes: of Bakers) Orders to (No.2) 1940, and the Defence (Stale Bread) Order, 1941.

No. 107. THE DEFENCE REGULATIONS, 1940 TO (No. 3) 1942.

Order made by the Competent Authority under Regulation 61. In exercise of the powers vested in me by virtue of my appointment by the Governor as the Competent Authority for the purposes of regulation 61 of the Defence Regulations, 1940 to (No. 3) 1942, I hereby order as follows :-

1. This Order may be cited as the Defence (Control of Gunny Sacks) Order, 1942. 2. For the purposes of this Order— "Gunny Sacks" means unused jute sacks weighing 11 ths. each or more.

3. Within three days from the date of the publication of this Order every person who has in his possession or under his control any gunny sacks exceeding 100 in number shall complete and deliver to me a return in the form set forth in the Schedule hereto in respect of the gunny sacks in his possession or under his control.

4.-(a) From and after the date of the publication of this Order in the Gazette no person who has in his possession or under his control any quantity of gunny sacks in excess of the quantity mentioned in clause 3 of this Order shall make use of or shall sell or dispose of any gunny sacks to any person except under a special permit issued under my hand.

(b) Every special permit issued under the provisions of paragraph (a) hereof may contain such terms and conditions as may be specified therein.

5. Every person shall permit such person as I or the Commissioner of the District may authorize in writing in that behalf, to enter upon and inspect his premises for the purpose of ascertaining whether the provisions of this Order have been or are being complied with, or for the purpose of checking the correctness or accuracy of any return made by such person under any of the provisions of this Order.
