principal town of the District in which such village is situated: Provided that in no case such addition shall exceed 10 paras per oke.

(b) Where whole wheat flour is purchased in a town for sale in another town

where whole wheat hair is purchased in a town for sale in another town in quantities of not less than one bag of 50 okes in respect of which a receipt has been given by the Municipal Weigher of the Municipality where the purchase has been made, there may be added to the maximum price of 167 paras per oke, 2 paras per oke for every 10 miles or part thereof by which the town in which the whole wheat flour is purchased is distant from the town in which it is sold: Provided that in no case such addition shall exceed 10 parts per oke.

(c) Where whole wheat flour milled at any mill situated at any village is sold

in any village there may be added to the maximum price of 163 paras per oke, 2 paras per oke for every 10 miles or part thereof by which such village is distant from the principal town of the District in which such village is situated: Provided that in no case such addition shall exceed 10 paras per oke."

ORDER MADE BY THE COMPETENT AUTHORITY UNDER REGULATION 61.

In exercise of the powers vested in me by virtue of my appointment by the Governor as the Competent Authority for the purposes of regulation 61 of the Defence Regulations, 1940 to (No. 6) 1941, I hereby order as follows:—

- 1. This Order may be cited as the Defence (Raisin Bread) Order, 1942.
- 2. For the purposes of this Order—
 "bread" means bread of any size, shape or kind and includes cakes and biscuits and what are commonly known as koullouria or paximadia.
- 3. From and after the 27th January, 1942, no person shall bake for his own use or for sale, or shall sell, offer for sale, or expose for sale, any bread, except bread containing a quantity of raisins not less than ten per cent, of the whole weight of bread,

4. Every person shall permit such person as I, or the Commissioner of the District, may authorize in writing in that behalf, to enter upon and inspect his premises for the purpose of ascertaining whether the provisions of this Order have been or are being complied with.

5. Any bread baked, sold, offered for sale, or exposed for sale may be seized by such person as I, or the Commissioner of the District in which such bread is found, may authorize in writing in that behalf, and may be disposed of in such manner as I, or the said Commissioner, as the case may be, may direct, without prejudice to any proceedings which may be taken for dny such contravention.

6. Any person who acts in contravention of the provisions of this Order is liable to the penalties prescribed in regulation 94 of the Defence Regulations, 1940 to (No. 6) 1941.

7. Nothing in this Order shall affect the validity of the Defence (Registration of Bakers) Orders to (No. 2) 1940, and the Defence (Stale Bread) Order, 1941.

No. 14. THE DEFENCE REGULATIONS, 1940 TO (No. 6) 1941.

ORDER MADE BY THE COMPETENT AUTHORITY UNDER REGULATION 61.

In exercise of the powers vested in me by virtue of my appointment by the Governor as the Competent Authority for the purposes of regulation 61 of the Defence Regulations, 1940 to (No. 6) 1941, I hereby order as follows:—

- 1. This Order may be cited as the Defence (Control of Slaughter of Lambs) Order, 1942.
 - 2.—(1) No person shall—
 - (a) slaughter any lamb weighing less than ten okes; or
 - (b) have in his possession the careass of a lamb weighing less than six and a half okes.
- (2) For the purpose of this paragraph the term "carcass" means the whole of the skinned carcass with the lungs, heart, liver and kidneys but without the other viscera.
- 3. I may appoint inspectors and the Commissioner of each District shall, if so required by me, appoint inspectors to ascertain whether the provisions of this Order have been, or are being, complied with and every inspector so appointed shall have power to enter at all times, at all reasonable hours, upon any premises for the purpose of carrying out any inspection or search which may be reasonably required in order to ascertain whether the provisions of this Order have been, or are being, complied with.
- 4. Any person who acts in contravention of or fails to comply with, any of the provisions of this Order is liable to the penalties prescribed in regulation 94 of the Defence Regulations, 1940 to (No. 6) 1941.
- 5. This Order shall come into operation on the 26th January, 1942, and the Defence (Control of Slaughter of Lambs) Order, 1940, shall thereupon be revoked.
