In this Part of the Schedule—

- (a) the term ‘ wholesale ’ referred in column (3) means sale or purchase of cigarettes in quantities of not less than 50 drams of cigarettes at any one time or at any single transaction ;
- (b) the term ‘ wholesale ’ referred in column (4) means sale or purchase of cigarettes in quantities of not less than 10 okes of cigarettes at any one time or at any single transaction.”

No. 140. THE DEFENCE REGULATIONS, 1940 TO (No. 4) 1942.

ORDER MADE BY THE COMPETENT AUTHORITY UNDER REGULATION 61.

In exercise of the powers vested in me by virtue of my appointment by the Governor as the Competent Authority for the purposes of regulation 61 of the Defence Regulations, 1940 to (No. 4) 1942, I hereby order as follows:—

1. This Order may be cited as the Defence (Control of Stocks of Local Soap) Order, 1942.

2. In this Order—

“local soap” means soap manufactured in the Colony.

3. Within three days from the date of the publication of this Order every person, who has in his possession or under his control any local soap in excess of 10 okes shall complete and deliver to me a declaration in the form set forth in the First Schedule hereto in respect of such local soap in his possession or under his control.

4. Not later than six days after the last day of each month, commencing from the month of May, 1942, any person who has in his possession or under his control any local soap in excess of 10 okes shall complete and deliver to me a return containing the particulars set forth in the Second Schedule hereto in respect of his dealings in local soap.

5. Every person shall permit such person as the Commissioner of the District or I may authorize in writing in that behalf, to enter upon and inspect his premises for the purpose of ascertaining whether the provisions of this Order have been or are being complied with, or for the purpose of checking the correctness or accuracy of any return made by such person under any of the provisions of this Order.

6. Nothing in this order shall apply to manufacturers of local soap.
