THE DEFENCE REGULATIONS, 1940 TO (No. 4) 1942. No. 180.

ORDER MADE UNDER REGULATION 61.

In exercise of the powers vested in the Controller of Supplies under paragraph (1) of regulation 61 of the Defence Regulations, 1940 to (No. 4) 1942, duly deputed to me under paragraph (6) of the said regulation, I do hereby order as follows:—

1. This Order may be cited as the Control of Transport (Disposal of Mechanical Vehicles and Parts) Order, 1942.

2. For the purposes of this Order—
"mechanical vehicle" means any vehicle propelled on the road by a mechanical prime-mover.

3. From and after the publication of this Order in the Gazette no person shall sell, transfer, part with or in any way dispose of,-

(a) any mechanical vehicle;(b) any part or fitting of any mechanical vehicle; without a permit in writing under my hand. Any such permit may be granted or refused at my discretion and may contain such terms and conditions as I may deem fit to impose.

4. Any person who acts in contravention of, or fails to comply with, any of the provisions of this Order or of any of the terms or conditions contained in any permit issued under clause 3 of this Order, is liable to the penalties prescribed in regulation 94 of the Defence Regulations, 1940 to (No. 4) 1942.
