THE CYPRUS VOLUNTEER FORCE LAWS, 1940 TO (No. 2) 1941.

PROCLAMATION MADE UNDER SECTION 11A.

C. C. WOOLLEY, Governor.

Whereas by section 11A of the Cyprus Volunteer Force Laws, 1940 to (No. 2) 1941, it is enacted that the Governor may, by Proclamation, call out and mobilize the Force or any part thereof for actual service whenever it appears advisable to

And whereas it appears to me advisable to call out and mobilize a certain officer:

therefore, I, Charles Campbell Woolley, Companion of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Officer of the Most Excellent Order of the British Empire, upon whom has been conferred the Decoration of the Military Cross, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Cyprus, in exercise of the powers vested in me by section 11a of the said Cyprus Volunteer Force Laws, 1940 to (No. 2) 1941, do hereby, by this Proclamation, call out and mobilize the officer whose name and particulars are set out in the first column of the Schedule hereto for the period set out in the second column of the said Schedule.

This Proclamation shall be deemed to have come into operation on the 28th day of May, 1942.

Lieutenant	Roberson, W. H.	1st June to 30th June, 1942, both dates inclusive.

THE CUSTOMS LAWS, 1936 TO (No. 2) 1941.

I, the Governor in Council, in exercise of the powers conferred by section 52 of

the Customs Laws, 1936 to (No. 2) 1941, do hereby order as follows:—

1. This Order may be cited as the Import Duty (Rennet Powder) Exemption

2. From and after the 29th day of May, 1942, all rennet powder imported into the Colony shall be admitted into the Colony free from all import duties.
