3. Notwithstanding anything in any law or public instrument contained :-

(a) all establishments situated in the District of Famagusta shall be closed and remain closed except between the hours of 5 a.m. and 12 midnight;

(b) no intoxicating liquor shall be sold, served, consumed or be in the possession or under the control of any person in any establishment or be permitted or suffered to be sold, served, consumed or be in the possession or under the control of any person in any establishment except-

(i) between the hours of 12 midday and 2 p.m., and 6 p.m. and 10.30 p.m., in any establishment situated within the municipal limits of the

towns of Famagusta and Varosha.

(ii) between the hours of 5 a.m. and 9 p.m. in any establishment situated in the District of Famagusta elsewhere than within the municipal limits of the towns of Famagusta and Varosha:

Provided that nothing in this clause contained shall render a person ordinarily in possession or control of intoxicating liquor in an establishment liable to prosecution by reason only of the fact that such person is in possession or control of intoxicating liquor held in an establishment for the purpose of the business carried on in such establishment.

4.—(1) Notwithstanding anything in this Order contained, upon the manager or person in charge of an establishment obtaining a permit under my hand-

(a) such establishment may remain open during such hours as may be specified

in such order; and intoxicating liquor may be sold, served, consumed or be in the possession or under the control of any person in such establishment during such hours as may be specified in such permit.

(2) Any such permit may contain such conditions as I may see fit to impose and

may be granted or refused at my absolute discretion.

5. Any person who acts in contravention of, or fails to comply with any of the provisions of this order or any condition contained in any permit issued under clause 4 of this order is liable to the penalties prescribed in regulation 94 of the Defence Regulations, 1940 to (No. 5) 1942, and any licence issued to such person in respect of the establishment, in which the offence was committed, under the Licensing Laws, 1889 to 1936, may be cancelled.

6. Nothing in this order contained shall be deemed to authorize the sale of intoxicating liquor by retail without a licence under the Licensing Laws, 1889 to 1936.

7. The Defence (Closing Time of Places of Public Resort and Entertainments) (Famagusta-Varosha) Order, 1939, and the Defence (Closing Time of Premises licensed for the Sale of Intoxicating Liquors) (Famagusta Varosha) Order, 1942, are hereby revoked.

## No. 215. THE DEFENCE REGULATIONS, 1940 TO (No. 5) 1942.

ORDER MADE BY THE COMPETENT AUTHORITY UNDER REGULATION 33.

In exercise of the powers vested in me by virtue of my appointment by the Governor as Competent Authority for the purposes of regulation 33 of the Defence Regulations, 1940 to (No. 5) 1942, I hereby order as follows:

This Order may be cited as the Defence (Control of Places of Public Resort

and Entertainment) (Paphos) Order, 1942.

2. In this Order—
"establishment" means any bar in any hotel, any cabaret, cinematograph
"establishment" means any bar in any hotel, any cabaret, cinematograph theatre, club, coffee-shop, confectioner's shop, restaurant, theatre and any other place or premises of public resort or entertainment whatsoever.

3. Netwithstanding anything in any law or public instrument contained: (a) all establishments situated in the District of Paphos shall be closed and

remain closed except between the hours of 5 a.m. and 12 midnight. (b) no intoxicating liquor shall be sold, served, consumed or be in the possession or under the control of any person in any establishment or be permitted or suffered to be sold, served, consumed or be in the possession or under the control of any person in any establishment except

(i) between the hours of 12 midday and 2 p.m., and 6 p.m. and 10.30 p.m. in any establishment situated within the municipal limits of the

towns of Ktima and Polis.

(ii) between the hours of 5 a.m. and 9 p.m. in any establishment situated in the District of Paphos elsewhere than within the municipal limits of the towns of Ktima and Polis:

Provided that nothing in this clause contained shall render a ordinarily in possession or control of intoxicating liquor in an establishment liable to prosecution by reason only of the fact that such person is in possession or control of intoxicating liquor held in an establishment for the purpose of the business carried on in such establishment.

4.-(1) Notwithstanding anything in this Order contained, upon the manager or person in charge of an establishment obtaining a permit under my hand-

(a) such establishment may remain open during such hours as may be specified

in such order; and
(b) intoxicating liquor may be sold, served, consumed or be in the possession or under the control of any person in such establishment during such hours as may be specified in such permit.

(2) Any such permit may contain such conditions as I may see fit to impose and

may be granted or refused at my absolute discretion.

5. (b) 2nd quality: Haradjida, kalamaria, kefalos, melanoura, murmuros, orphos, sarpes, sfirna, skaros, sorkos, souros, stringla,

vlahos and voppa (c) 3rd quality: Drakena, hannos, litsa, marida, octapodi, palamida, perka, skorpios, skillos, smyrna, supia, tseroulles, vati, velonida, asheli and any other varieties

(d) 4th quality: Rejects (skarta) of all varieties...
