THE EMERGENCY POWERS (DEFENCE) ACTS, 1939 AND 1940,

REGULATIONS MADE BY THE GOVERNOR.

C. C. WOOLLEY, Governor.

I, the Governor, in exercise of the powers conferred by the Emergency Powers (Defence) Acts, 1939 and 1940, as extended to the Colony by the Emergency Powers (Colonial Defence) Order in Council, 1939, and the Emergency Powers (Colonial Defence) (Amendment) Order in Council, 1940, do hereby make the following

1. These regulations may be cited as the Defence (Amendment No. 6) Regulations, 1942, and shall be read as one with the Defence Regulations, 1940 to (No. 5) 1942, (hereinafter referred to as "the principal Regulations"), and the principal Regulations and these regulations may together be cited as the Defence Regulations, 1940 to (No. 6) 1942,

2. Regulation 55 of the principal Regulations is hereby amended as follows:— (a) by the insertion therein of the following sub-paragraph immediately after of regulation

sub-paragraph (b):—
"(c) for controlling or regulating the charges to be made for the carriage of passengers or goods in any vehicle or any class of vehicles; "; (b) by the addition thereto of the following paragraph, the present regulation

being numbered as paragraph (1):—

"(2) The Governor may by order, if it appears to him expedient so to do, delegate to any person, subject to such limitations and conditions as he may in such order provide, any of the powers conferred upon him by the provisions of paragraph (1) hereof."

3. Regulation 95A of the principal Regulations is hereby revoked and the following Substitution

regulation substituted therefor: "Špecial

tribunals.

95A.—(1) Notwithstanding anything in these regulations contained lation 95A. but without prejudice to the operation thereof the Governor may, if he sees fit, by order, establish in the Colony or in such part or area thereof as may be specified in the order, special tribunals which shall be composed and have jurisdiction as hereinafter provided.

(2) Every such tribunal shall be composed of such Judge of the

Supreme Court, President of a District Court, or District Judge as the

Chief Justice may direct.

(3) Every such tribunal shall have jurisdiction to try summarily all offences against these regulations and shall have all the powers of an Assize Court.

(4) The proceedings of every such tribunal shall conform, as nearly as may be, with the practice and procedure for the time being in force relating to the hearing of criminal matters by an Assize Court.

(5) The judgment of every such tribunal shall be final and conclusive

and no appeal shall lie therefrom:

Provided that where any person has been sentenced to suffer death the proceedings shall be subject to review by a Court of Review consisting of not less than three Judges of the Supreme Court, or two Judges of the Supreme Court and one President of a District Court. (6) For the purpose of this regulation the term Judge of the Supreme Court shall include an acting Judge of the Supreme Court.
(7) In the reviewing of proceedings the Court of Review shall have

all the powers granted to the Supreme Court by sub-section (1) of section 40 of the Courts of Justice Laws, 1935 to 1940, on the hearing of criminal appeals in so far as such powers may be applicable, and any reference in such sub-section to 'District Court' shall be construed as a reference to any special tribunal established under this regulation.

(8) The Governor, with the assistance and advice of the Chief Justice, may by writing under the hand and official seal of the Governor and the hand of the Chief Justice make Rules of Court for regulating the practice (including forms) in respect of any proceeding under this regulation before the Court of Review."
