I, the Governor in Council, in exercise of the powers conferred by section 59 of the Income Tax Laws, 1941 and 1942, and of every other power hereunto enabling, do hereby make the following rules:—

1. These rules may be cited as the Income Tax (Notice and Returns to Commissioner) Amendment Rules, 1942, and shall be read as one with the Income Tax (Notice and Returns to Commissioner) Rules, 1941, (hereinafter referred to as "the principal Rules"), and the principal Rules and these rules may together be cited as the Income Tax (Notice and Returns to Commissioner) Rules, 1941 and 1942. *Gazette :

2. Rule 2 of the principal Rules is hereby amended by the deletion therefrom of the words "30th day of April" and the substitution therefor of the words "28th day of February".

3. Rule 3 of the principal Rules is hereby amended by the deletion therefrom of the words "30th day of April" and the substitution therefor of the words "28th day of February".

No. 22. THE ADULTERATION OF PRODUCE LAWS, 1926 TO 1935.**AUTHORIZATION UNDER SECTION 2.**

No. 23.**THE DEFENCE (CONTROL OF SALE PRICES OF SCHEDULED ARTICLES) CONSOLIDATION ORDERS, 1940 AND 1941.****NOTICE No. 56 UNDER CLAUSE 13.**

A.—The Schedule is hereby amended by the addition to Part 1 of the following with effect from the 22nd January, 1942:—

"*Exception* : Where wheat is issued either for cash or on deferred payment by the Director of Agriculture the prices may be as fixed by the Director of Agriculture."

B.—The Schedule is hereby amended by the deletion therefrom of Part 18 and the substitution therefor of the following part:—

“PART 18.—MATCHES.

Brand of Matches.	Retail Price.	Wholesale Price.
All brands	10½ piastres per packet of 10 boxes or 90 paras per two boxes.	11 shillings and 2 piastres per 100 boxes.

In this part of the Schedule—

the term ‘wholesale’ means sale or purchase of matches of not less than 100 boxes at any one time or at any single transaction.

Limitation: No person selling matches by retail shall refuse to sell a packet of 10 boxes.”

C.—The Schedule is hereby amended by the deletion therefrom of Part 20 and the substitution therefor of the following part:—
