

9. Every person shall permit such person as I or the Commissioner of the District may authorize by writing in that behalf, to enter upon and inspect his premises for the purpose of ascertaining whether the provisions of this Order have been or are being complied with, or for the purpose of checking the correctness or accuracy of any return made by such person under any of the provisions of this Order.

10. Nothing in this Order contained shall apply to any tyres or used tyres which are the property of the War Department or which are dealt with under the direct authority of the Military Authorities :

Provided that any person not being a member of His Majesty's Forces, who obtains or acquires any tyres or used tyres under the direct authority of the Military Authorities shall, as soon as he obtains or acquires any such tyres or used tyres, notify me in writing in that behalf.

11. Any person who acts in contravention of, or fails to comply with any of the provisions of this Order or of the terms or conditions contained in any permit issued under this Order, is liable to the penalties prescribed in regulation 94 of the Defence Regulations, 1940 to (No. 5) 1942.

12. The Defence (Sale of Tyres) Control Orders, 1940 to 1942, are hereby revoked.
