# SUBSIDIARY LEGISLATION.

No. 248.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.-No. 2047.

MADE UNDER

THE LANDING AND SHIPPING CHARGES LAW, 1933.

C. C. WOOLLEY,

Governor.

I, the Governor in Council, in exercise of the powers conferred by the Landing and Shipping Charges Law, 1933, do hereby order as follows:—

- 1. This Order may be cited as the Landing and Shipping Charges Order, 1942.
- 2. In this Order-

"boat" means any boat licensed under the Boat Regulation Law, 1884, or any Law amending or substituted for the same.

"lighterage" means the transport of goods by a boat from ship's sling to the shore, jetty or pier and shall include the unloading of such goods from the boat to the shore, jetty or pier.

"sous palan" means that goods are consigned under an agreement whereby the consignee shall take delivery of the same from ship's sling for conveyance to the shore, jetty or pier without the intervention of an agent.

- 3.—(1) Subject to the provisions of this Order the rates for landing charges at all ports shall not exceed the rates contained in the respective columns of Part I of the First Schedule hereto.
- (2) The services to be rendered and the payments to be included in such landing charges shall be as specified in Part II of the First Schedule hereto.
- 4. In the case of goods consigned sous palan the agent may charge the consignee of such goods a fee not exceeding 15% of the rates provided for landing charges under this Order, after deduction of lighterage and porterage.
- 5. In the case of goods destined for Cyprus which are transhipped en route,  $33\frac{1}{3}\%$  of the landing charges, after deduction of lighterage and porterage, shall be paid by the agent of the vessel or the steamer landing such goods to the agent of the vessel or steamer from which such goods are transhipped.
- 6.—(1) The rates for porterage at all ports shall not exceed the rates contained in Part I of the Second Schedule hereto.
- (2) The services to be rendered in respect of such porterage shall be as specified in Part II of the Second Schedule hereto.
- 7. The Landing and Shipping Charges (No. 2) Order, 1933 and 1940, are hereby Gazettes: evoked.

No. 249. THE DEFENCE REGULATIONS, 1940 TO (No. 6) 1942.

DELEGATION OF POWERS UNDER PARAGRAPH (5) OF REGULATION 66.

C. C. WOOLLEY, Governor.

I, the Governor, in exercise of the powers conferred by paragraph (5) of regulation 66 of the Defence Regulations, 1940 to (No. 6) 1942, do hereby depute the person for the time being holding the office designated in the second column of the Schedule hereto to exercise and perform on my behalf the powers mentioned in the first column of the said Schedule which I am empowered to exercise and perform under the provisions of paragraphs (1), (2), (3) and (4) of regulation 66 of the Defence Regulations, 1940 to (No. 6) 1942.

#### SCHEDULE.

The power to requisition drugs, chemicals and surgical supplies, and the powers connected with such requisitioning conferred by paragraphs (1), (2), (3) and (4) of regulation 66 of the Defence Regulations, 1940 to (No. 6) 1942.
