THE BANK HOLIDAYS LAW, 1928.

PROCLAMATION MADE BY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL UNDER SECTION 6.

In exercise of the powers vested in me by section 6 of the Bank Holidays Law, 1928, and with the advice of the Executive Council, I, Charles Campbell Woolley, Companion of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Officer of the Most Excellent Order of the British Empire, upon whom has been conferred the Decoration of the Military Cross, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Cyprus, do hereby proclaim that Friday the 3rd day of July, 1942, is hereby appointed to be and shall be observed as a bank holiday for the purposes of the said Law.

THE EMERGENCY POWERS (DEFENCE) ACTS, 1939 AND 1940.

REGULATIONS MADE BY THE GOVERNOR.

C. C. WOOLLEY, Governor.

I, the Governor, in exercise of the powers conferred by the Emergency Powers (Defence) Acts, 1939 and 1940, as extended to the Colony by the Emergency Powers (Colonial Defence) Order in Council, 1939 and the Emergency Powers (Colonial Defence) (Amendment) Order in Council, 1940, do hereby make the following regulations:—

1.—(1) These regulations may be cited as the Defence (Application of the Banking Business (Temporary Restrictions) Laws, 1939, to Co-operative Societies) Regulations, 1942.

(2) The Interpretation Law, 1935, shall apply to the interpretation of these 26 of 1935 Regulations as it applies to the interpretation of a Law.

2. The Banking Business (Temporary Restrictions) Laws, 1939, shall apply to 17 of 1939 all Co-operative Societies registered under the Co-operative Societies Law, 1939. 18 of 1939 25 of 1939
