THE CYPRUS VOLUNTEER FORCE LAWS, 1940 TO (No. 2) 1941, AS AMENDED BY THE AMENDMENT OF THE CYPRUS VOLUNTEER FORCE LAWS, 1940 TO (No. 2) 1941, (DEFENCE) REGULATIONS, 1942.

PROCLAMATION MADE UNDER SECTION 11A.

Whereas by section 11A of the Cyprus Volunteer Force Laws, 1940 to (No. 2) 1941, as amended by the Amendment of the Cyprus Volunteer Force Laws, 1940 to (No. 2) 1941, (Defence) Regulations, 1942, it is enacted that the Governor may, by Proclamation, call out and mobilize the Force or any part thereof for actual service whenever it appears advisable to do so:

And whereas it appears to me advisable to call out and mobilize a certain officer:

Now, therefore, I, Charles Campbell Woolley, Companion of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Officer of the Most Excellent Order of the British Empire, upon whom has been conferred the Decoration of the Military Cross, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Cyprus, in exercise of the powers vested in me by section 11A of the said Cyprus Volunteer Force Laws, 1940 to (No. 2) 1941, as amended by the Amendment of the Cyprus Volunteer Force Laws, 1940 to (No. 2) 1941, (Defence) Regulations, 1942, do hereby, by this Proclamation, call out and mobilize Second Lieutenant H. S. Richards as from the 8th day of July, 1942.

Given under my hand and the Public Seal of the Colony at Nicosia, this 23rd day of July, 1942.

THE MISSIONARY EDUCATIONAL AND MEDICAL (ALIEN REGULATION) LAWS, 1922 AND 1933.

PERMIT UNDER SECTION 8.

Whereas in pursuance of the provisions of the Missionary Educational and Medical (Alien Regulation) Laws, 1922 and 1933, the person whose name appears in the Schedule hereto has applied for a permit under the provisions of the said Laws;

And whereas the said person has given an undertaking in writing to pay all due obedience and respect to the Government of Cyprus, and while carefully abstaining from participation in political affairs, that he desires and purposes *ex animo* to work in friendly co-operation with the said Government in all matters in which his influence might properly be exerted; and, in particular, he has undertaken that if engaged in educational work, his influence will be exerted to promote loyalty to the Government of Cyprus in the minds of his pupils, and to make them good citizens of the British Empire;

Now, therefore, I, the Governor in Council, in exercise of the powers conferred by section 8 of the Missionary Educational and Medical (Alien Regulation) Laws, 1922 and 1933, do hereby grant to the person whose name appears in the Schedule hereto a permit to commence and carry on the work set down after his name.

No. 299. THE POST OFFICE LAWS, 1881 TO 1933.

ORDER IN COUNCIL No. 2049.

MADE UNDER SECTION 6.

C. C. WOOLLEY,
Governor.

I, the Governor in Council, in exercise of the powers conferred by section 6 of the Post Office Laws, 1881 to 1933, do hereby order as follows:—

1. This Order may be cited as the Post Office (Air Mail Rate of Postage) Order, 1942.

2. There shall be charged a combined Postage and Air fee, in addition to late and/or registration fees, at the rates set forth in the second and third columns of the Schedule hereto, on letters, printed papers, commercial papers, samples, small packets and postcards intended for transmission by air mail to any of the countries of destination enumerated in the first column of the said Schedule, such transmission to be effected—

- (a) by air or surface route from the Colony to Egypt or Palestine; and
(b) from Egypt or Palestine to the country of destination either wholly by air or partially by air and partially by surface route.

3. The Post Office (Air Mail Rate of Postage) Order, 1942, and the Post Office (Special Air Mail Rate of Postage) Order, 1942, are hereby revoked.
