**No. 320. THE COSTS OF PROSECUTIONS (AMENDMENT)  
(RULES OF COURT), 1942.**

His Excellency the Governor, with the advice and assistance of the Chief Justice, in exercise of the powers vested in him by clause 217 of the Cyprus Courts of Justice Order, 1927, or otherwise, hereby makes the following rules :—

1. These rules may be cited as the Costs of Prosecutions (Amendment) (Rules of Court), 1942, and shall be read as one with the Costs of Prosecutions (Rules of Court), 1932, (hereinafter referred to as the "principal Rules"), and the principal Rules and these rules may together be cited as the Costs of Prosecutions (Rules of Court), 1932 and 1942.

2. The Appendix to the principal Rules is hereby revoked and replaced as follows :—

**APPENDIX.**

**PART I.—ALLOWANCES FOR ATTENDANCE**

*Per diem.*

**CLASS 1.—Professional persons, bankers, and wholesale merchants :—**

For men 10/- to £1. 10s. for the first day and  
5/- to 15/- thereafter.

For women 3/- to 9/-.

**CLASS 2.—Artisans, cafékeepers, peasant proprietors who employ labourers, tradesmen, shopkeepers and clerks :—**

For men 3/- to 6/-.

For women 2/4½ to 4/-.

**CLASS 3.—Servants, labourers, and ordinary peasants :—**

For men 2/- to 4/-.

For women 1/4½ to 3/-.

**CLASS 4.—Children under 12 :—**

1/- to 2/-, plus an allowance to an escort, if necessary, at the rate appropriate to the class of witness to which the escort belongs.

Unclassified persons may, according to their station in life, be allowed up to 10/- a day.

The registrar may, where the court does not otherwise direct and where he so thinks fit, allow a witness less than the minimum laid down above.

**PART II.—ALLOWANCES FOR TRANSPORT.**

All persons :—Single fare in public conveyance both ways at current rates : claims to be supported by voucher.
