THE MUNICIPAL CORPORATIONS LAWS, 1930 TO 1941.

BYE-LAWS MADE BY THE COUNCIL OF THE MUNICIPAL CORPORATION of Lefkoniko.

In exercise of the powers vested in them by the Municipal Corporations Laws, 1930 to 1941 and otherwise, the Council of the Municipal Corporation of Lefkoniko hereby make the following bye-laws :--

1. These bye-laws may be cited as the Municipal Corporation (Lefkoniko) Bye-laws, 1942, and shall be read as one with the Municipal Corporation (Lefkoniko) Bye-laws, 1940 and 1941 (hereinafter referred to as "the principal Bye-laws") and the principal Bye-laws and these bye-laws may together be cited as the Municipal Corporation (Lefkoniko) Bye-laws, 1940 to 1942.

Chapter 8.—Street and House-to-House Collection.

2. Bye-laws Nos. 208 and 209 of the principal Bye-laws are hereby

revoked and substituted by the following:-

"208. No person shall make or attempt to make any street and house-to-house collection for any charitable philanthropic or other purpose unless such person or the institution or society of which such person is a member shall have previously obtained a licence from the Council in that behalf.

209. Every such licence shall state the date or dates, the manner and the time or times at which the collection to which the licence relates shall be made, and may contain such other terms and conditions as the Council may in each case determine.'

The above bye-laws have been approved by His Excellency the Governor.
