THE POST OFFICE LAWS, 1881 TO 1933

ORDER IN COUNCIL No. 2040

MADE UNDER SECTION 6.

I, the Governor in Council, in exercise of the powers conferred by section 6 of the Post Office Laws, 1881 to 1933, do hereby order as follows:-

1. This Order may be cited as the Post Office (His Majesty's Forces Parcels

2. Notwithstanding anything in any other Order contained parcels addressed to His Majesty's Forces shall be charged with the following reduced rates of

THE DEFENCE REGULATIONS, 1940 TO (No. 1) 1942.

R. by 44/200

ORDER MADE UNDER REGULATION 55. C. C. WOOLLEY,

Governor.

I, the Governor, in exercise of the powers conferred by regulation 55 of the Defence Regulations, 1940 to (No. 1) 1942, do hereby order as follows:—

- 1. This Order may be cited as the Defence (Use of Certain Vehicles) Order, 1942. 2. From and after the 1st day of March, 1942, no person shall use any carriage, cart or bicycle on any road in the Colony, between half an hour after sunset and half an hour before sunrise unless
 - (a) in the case of a carriage, he causes the whole of the back panel to be painted white;

(b) in the case of a cart, he causes the back to be whitened;

(c) in the case of a bicycle, he causes the rear mudguard to be painted white

to an extent of 12 inches from the end of the back part thereof.

3. Any person who acts in contravention of this Order is liable to the penalties prescribed in regulation 94 of the Defence Regulations, 1940 to (No. 1) 1942.
