

No. 48. THE DEFENCE REGULATIONS, 1940 TO (No. 1) 1942.

ORDER MADE BY THE COMPETENT AUTHORITY UNDER REGULATION 61.

In exercise of the powers vested in me by virtue of my appointment by the Governor as the Competent Authority for the purposes of regulation 61 of the Defence Regulations, 1940 to (No. 1) 1942, I hereby order as follows:—

1. This Order may be cited as the Defence (Cigarette Manufacturers Control) Order, 1942.

In this Order—

“cigarettes” means all articles made of cut, pressed or rubbed tobacco rolled or enveloped in paper, leaf or other covering intended to be smoked in such covering.

“cigarette manufacturer” means any person who owns or controls any factory wherein tobacco or cigarettes are manufactured.

“tobacco” means tobacco seedlings, plants, leaves and their stems and fibres and includes any form of tobacco other than manufactured tobacco.

2.—(1) From and after the 1st March, 1942, no person shall carry on the business of a cigarette manufacturer save under a special permit issued under my hand.

(2) Every special permit issued under the provisions of paragraph (1) hereof may contain such terms and conditions (including the quantity and description of cigarettes to be produced monthly and the price at which such cigarettes may be sold or purchased) as may be specified therein.

3. Any person who acts in contravention of, or fails to comply with, any of the provisions of this Order or any term or condition contained in any special permit issued under the provisions of this Order is liable to the penalties prescribed in regulation 94 of the Defence Regulations, 1940 to (No. 1) 1942.

ORDER MADE BY THE COMPETENT AUTHORITY UNDER REGULATION 61.

1. This Order may be cited as the Defence (Cigarettes Retail Prices) Order, 1942.

2. In this Order—

the words “cigarettes” and “cigarette manufacturers” shall have the same meaning as in the Defence (Cigarette Manufacturers Control) Order, 1942.

3. From and after the 7th March, 1942, no person shall purchase or sell cigarettes at a price exceeding the price marked by the cigarette manufacturers on the packets of such cigarettes.

4. Any person who acts in contravention of, or fails to comply with, any of the provisions of this Order is liable to the penalties prescribed in regulation 94 of the Defence Regulations, 1940 to (No. 1) 1942.
