SUBSIDIARY LEGISLATION.

No. 80. ^{C.V.} THE DEFENCE REGULATIONS, 1940 TO (No. 2) 1942.

ORDER MADE BY THE COMPETENT AUTHORITY UNDER REGULATION 61.

In exercise of the powers vested in me by virtue of my appointment by the Governor as the Competent Authority for the purposes of regulation 61 of the Defence Regulations, 1940 to (No. 2) 1942, I hereby order as follows:—

1. This Order may be cited as the Defence (Coal Control) Order, 1942.
- 2.—(a) On and after the publication of this Order in the *Gazette* no person who has in his possession or under his control any quantity of coal in excess of one ton shall make use of or shall sell or dispose of any coal to any person except under a special permit issued under my hand.
(b) Every special permit issued under the provisions of paragraph (a) hereof may contain such terms and conditions as may be specified therein.
3. Any person who acts in contravention of, or fails to comply with, any of the provisions of this Order is liable to the penalties prescribed in regulation 94 of the Defence Regulations, 1940 to (No. 2) 1942.
