## THE EMERGENCY POWERS (DEFENCE) ACTS, 1939 AND 1940.

## REGULATIONS MADE BY THE GOVERNOR.

Governor.

I, the Governor, in exercise of the powers conferred by the Emergency Powers (Defence) Acts, 1939 and 1940, as extended to the Colony by the Emergency Powers (Colonial Defence) Order in Council, 1939, and the Emergency Powers (Colonial Defence) (Amendment) Order in Council, 1940, do hereby make the following regulations:—

1. These regulations may be cited as the Defence (Amendment No. 3) Regulations, 1942, and shall be read as one with the Defence Regulations, 1940 to (No. 2) 1942, (hereinafter referred to as "the principal Regulations"), and the principal Regulations and these regulations may together be cited as the Defence Regulations 1940 to (No. 3) 1942.

Insertion of  
new regula-  
tion 34A.

2. The following regulation shall be inserted in the principal Regulations immediately after regulation 34:—

"Theft of 34A.—(1) Any person who—  
property (a) steals any article or goods whatsoever belonging to His Majesty ;  
belonging to (b) unlawfully receives or takes upon himself the control or dispo-  
His Majesty. sition of, or has in his possession, any article or goods knowing  
the same to be an article or goods belonging to His Majesty ;  
shall be guilty of an offence against this regulation and shall be tried  
by the President of a District Court or a District Judge and on conviction  
shall be liable to imprisonment for any term not exceeding seven years  
or to a fine not exceeding five hundred pounds or to both such imprison-  
ment and fine.

(2) Any person who unlawfully receives or takes upon himself the control or disposition of, or has in his possession, any article or goods to which this regulation applies shall be deemed to have known that the article or goods belonged to His Majesty unless he establishes to the satisfaction of the Court that he did not know and had no reasonable ground to suspect that such article or goods belonged to His Majesty."

3. Regulation 61 of the principal Regulations is hereby amended by the insertion immediately after paragraph (9) of the following paragraph:—

"(10) Any person who contravenes or fails to comply with any order made under paragraph (1) (a) of this regulation regulating or prohibiting the keeping, storage or sale of articles of any description, or controlling the prices at which such articles may be sold shall be guilty of an offence and shall be tried by the President of a District Court or a District Judge and on conviction shall be liable, notwithstanding anything in any order contained, to imprisonment for any term not exceeding seven years or to a fine not exceeding five hundred pounds or to both such imprisonment and fine."

tion 79c.

4.—(1) Regulation 79c of the principal Regulations is hereby amended by the insertion immediately after paragraph (8) of the following paragraphs:—

"(9) The Commandant of the Air Raid Precaution Services may, on the application of any person registered in any area for the performance of part-time air raid precaution duties, transfer such person to another area, and any person so transferred shall be liable to perform part-time air raid precaution duties in the area to which he has been so transferred as if he had originally registered in that area for the performance of part-time air raid precaution duties.

(10)—(i) Any person convicted by any Court for having contravened or failed to comply with any order relating to registration made under this regulation may, by notice in writing under the hand of the Commandant of the Air Raid Precaution Services, be required to register, within such time as may be specified in such notice, for the performance of part-time air raid precaution duties in the area in which he should have registered under the provisions of such order.

(ii) Any person who fails to comply with any notice issued under sub-paragraph (i) of this paragraph shall be guilty of an offence against this regulation and shall be liable to a fine not exceeding five pounds for every day during which the default continues."

(2) This regulation shall be deemed to have come into operation on the 15th day of December, 1941.

5. Paragraph (2) of regulation 94 of the principal Regulations is hereby amended by the deletion of the figures " 61 " which appear in line 3 thereof.

**THE TREE PLANTING VILLAGE AREAS LAWS, 1930 TO 1936.**

**ORDER MADE UNDER SECTION 13.**

In exercise of the powers vested in him by section 13 of the Tree Planting Village Areas Laws, 1930 to 1936, His Excellency the Governor is pleased to order and it is hereby ordered as follows :—

The area described in the Schedule hereto is hereby declared to be and shall be reserved as the Tree Planting Area of the village of Tokhni, in the District of Larnaca.

**SCHEDULE.**

The area lying within the following boundaries, that is to say :—

The boundary commences at the most northern point of plot No. 311 of the Government Survey Plan No. LV/5 (the Greek Cemetery) on the road from Zygi to the village of Tokhni, and proceeds northwards and north-eastwards along the boundaries of, and including, plots Nos. 307, 298 and 297 of the said plan to the most northern point of plot No. 297, on a footpath; thence south-eastwards and south-westwards along the said footpath through the locality " Perivolia " to the most southern point of plot No. 237 of the Government Survey Plan No. LV/13, on the main road from Nicosia to Limassol; thence southwards, crossing the said road, and south-eastwards along a footpath through the localities " Pieridhes," " Kapsaloudhia " and " Laxidhia," to the most eastern point of plot No. 371 of the Government Survey Plan LV/21; thence southwards, eastwards and southwards along the boundaries of, and including, plots Nos. 372 and 375 of the said plan, plots Nos. 60, 61, 62, 63 and 64 of the Government Survey Plan No. LV/29 to the south-eastern corner of the said plot No. 64, on the road from the village of Maroni to Zygi; thence southwards along the said road to the most southern point of plot No. 205 of the said plan; thence north-westwards and south-westwards along the boundaries of, and including, plots Nos. 205 and 208 of the said plan to the most southern point of plot No. 208, on a footpath; thence north-westwards along the said footpath through the localities " Khardjes " and " Livadhia " to the south-western corner of plot No. 201 of the Government Survey Plan No. LV/21, on the road from Zygi to the village of Tokhni; thence north-westwards and north-eastwards along the said road to the point of commencement; all which said area comprises 1,407 donums or thereabouts as shown edged in red on the plan filed in the D.L.R.S. M.P. No. 462/1940.

4. Lambousa Monastery, Karavas.
