

No. 88. THE CUSTOMS LAWS, 1936 TO 1941.

NOTIFICATION UNDER SECTION 66.

No. 89. THE GOVERNMENT WATERWORKS LAW, 1928.

SECTIONS 5 AND 6.

It is hereby notified for general information that His Excellency the Governor in exercise of the powers conferred by sections 5 and 6 of the Government Waterworks Law, 1928:—

- (a) has determined that the following waterworks shall be undertaken with regard to the water of the river known as Maroniou at the locality Louria situated near the village of Maroni in the District of Larnaca for the purpose of making such water available for irrigation, that is to say,—
two weirs, two storage tanks and water channels;
- (b) has appointed the following Water Commissioners in order to ascertain and record the nature, extent and situation of any existing water rights which may be injuriously affected by the carrying out of the said waterworks, that is to say,—

No. 90. THE DEFENCE REGULATIONS, 1940 TO (No. 2) 1942.

ORDER MADE BY THE COMPETENT AUTHORITY UNDER REGULATION 61.

In exercise of the powers vested in me by virtue of my appointment by the Governor as the Competent Authority for the purposes of regulation 61 of the Defence Regulations, 1940 to (No. 2) 1942, I hereby order as follows:—

- This Order may be cited as the Defence (Sale of Cow's Milk) Order, 1942.
- (a) From and after the 9th day of April, 1942, no person shall sell or offer for sale any cow's milk or any milk of sheep or goats mixed with cow's milk except under a special permit issued by the Chief Veterinary Officer or any person authorized in writing by him in that behalf.
(b) Every special permit issued under the provisions of paragraph (a) hereof may contain such terms and conditions as may be specified therein.
- Any person who acts in contravention of, or fails to comply with, any of the provisions of this Order is liable to the penalties prescribed in regulation 94 of the Defence Regulations, 1940 to (No. 2) 1942.
