

No. 99. THE DEFENCE REGULATIONS, 1940 TO (No.2) 1942.

ORDER MADE BY THE BOARD FOR THE DISTRICT OF NICOSIA.

The Board for the District of Nicosia in exercise of the power and authority vested in them in virtue of their appointment by the Governor as Competent Authority for the said District to fix, under regulation 61 of the Defence Regulations, 1940 to (No. 2) 1942, the maximum prices at which any goods or articles whatsoever produced or grown in Cyprus or made or consisting of materials mainly produced or grown in Cyprus, may be sold, do hereby, with the approval of the Central Board, order as follows :—

1. This Order may be cited as the Defence (Control of Sale Prices of Certain Articles) (Nicosia District) Order, 1942.

2. This Order shall be in operation only in the town of Nicosia.

3. Subject to such definitions, conditions, exceptions, limitations and modifications, if any, as may be set out in the Schedule hereto, no person shall sell or purchase any article mentioned in such Schedule at a price in excess of the price relating to such article, specified in such Schedule :

Provided that whenever the price for the whole quantity of such article involves the payment of a fraction of ten paras, there may be charged and paid therefor a sum of ten paras.

4. The provisions of the Defence (Control of Sale Prices of Scheduled Articles) Orders, 1940 and 1941, together with any amendment thereto shall apply *mutatis mutandis* to this Order and all the powers thereunder vested in or exercised by the Controller of Supplies as a Competent Authority shall, with regard to any article mentioned in the Schedule hereto, vest in, and be exercised by, the Board for the District of Nicosia.

No. 100. THE DEFENCE REGULATIONS, 1940 TO (No. 2) 1942.

ORDER MADE BY THE COMPETENT AUTHORITY UNDER REGULATION 61.

In exercise of the powers vested in me by virtue of my appointment by the Governor as the Competent Authority for the purposes of regulation 61 of the Defence Regulations, 1940 to (No. 2) 1942, I hereby order as follows :—

1. This Order may be cited as the Defence (Control of Carobs) Order, 1942.

2. In this Order—

“carobs” mean whole carobs, kibbled carobs, meal of carobs and carob kernels.

3. Within three days from the date of the publication of this Order every person who has in his possession or under his control any carobs in excess of one ton shall complete and deliver to me a declaration in the form set forth in the First Schedule hereto in respect of the carobs in his possession or under his control.

4. Not later than six days after the last day of each month, commencing from the month of April, 1942, any person who has in his possession or under his control any carobs in excess of one ton shall complete and deliver to me a return containing the particulars set forth in the Second Schedule hereto in respect of his dealings in carobs.

5.—(a) From and after the date of the publication of this Order in the *Gazette* no person who has in his possession or under his control any quantity of carobs in excess of the quantity mentioned in clause 3 of this Order shall make use of or shall sell or dispose of any carobs in excess of one ton at any one time or at any single transaction to any person except under a special permit issued under my hand.

(b) Every special permit issued under the provisions of paragraph (a) hereof may contain such terms and conditions as may be specified therein.

6. Every person shall permit such person as I or the Commissioner of the District may authorize in writing in that behalf, to enter upon and inspect his premises for the purpose of ascertaining whether the provisions of this Order have been or are being complied with, or for the purpose of checking the correctness or accuracy of any return made by such person under any of the provisions of this Order.

7. Any person who—
 (a) acts in contravention of, or fails to comply with, any of the provisions of this Order, or
 (b) makes, under any of the provisions of this Order, a return which is false in any material particular,
 is liable to the penalties prescribed in regulation 94 of the Defence Regulations, 1940 to (No. 2) 1942.
