## THE DEFENCE (CONTROL OF SALE PRICES OF SCHEDULED ARTICLES) CONSOLIDATION ORDERS, 1940 TO 1942.

## NOTICE NO. 100 UNDER CLAUSE 13.

A.—The Schedule is hereby amended by the deletion therefrom of Part 17 (relating to Local Cheese).

B.—The Schedule is hereby amended by the deletion therefrom of Part 2 and the substitution therefor, with effect from the 1st April, 1943, of the following:—  
“PART 2.—BARLEY.

(1)	(2)
All towns and villages .. .. .	Price 120 paras per oke.

*Modification:*

Any foreign ingredient or extraneous matter in any barley in excess of the maximum percentage of 4% permitted by the Adulteration of Produce (Local Sales) Regulations, 1940 and 1941, shall not be paid for and there may be deducted from the price of such barley, by the purchaser or the person taking delivery, any expenses required or incurred for cleaning such barley from any foreign ingredient or extraneous matter in excess of 4% as aforesaid.

*Condition:*

Where sales of barley are made by the Government the purchaser shall surrender to the Government on each occasion a number of empty bags in good condition equivalent to the number of bags purchased by him.

*Limitation:*

The maximum price for sales of barley from Government stocks is  $2\frac{3}{4}$  piastres per oke.”

C.—The Schedule is hereby amended by the deletion therefrom of Part 23 and the substitution therefor, with effect from 1st April, 1943, of the following part:—

“PART 23.—KEROSENE.

(1)	(2)
Price for every four gallons in bulk	Price for every four gallons in new sealed tins ( <i>i.e.</i> with the tin).
56½ piastres. .. .. .	69½ piastres.

*Modification:* The price for any lesser quantity of kerosene in bulk shall be:—

- (a) when sold by the oke in Sale's Centres a price not exceeding 6 piastres per oke on the basis of 11 okes net per four gallons;
- (b) when sold by Mukhtars in villages other than Sale's Centres a price not exceeding  $6\frac{3}{4}$  piastres per oke on the basis of 11 okes net per four gallons.

The price for any lesser quantity of kerosene ex new sealed tins shall be:—

- (a) when sold by the oke in Sale's Centres a price not exceeding 7 piastres per oke on the basis of 11 okes net per four gallons;
- (b) when sold by Mukhtars in villages other than Sale's Centres a price not exceeding  $7\frac{1}{2}$  piastres per oke on the basis of 11 okes net per four gallons.”

D.—The Schedule is hereby amended by the addition to Part 22 of the following:—

“*Modification:*

Provided that where fuel oil is sold in new sealed tins the price of each tin containing 4 gallons will be 8s. 3p.”
