No. 142. BY THE GOVERNOR.

A PROCLAMATION.

Whereas His Majesty the King by Letters Patent bearing date the First day of February, 1943, passed under the Great Seal of the Realm, (hereinafter referred to as "the Letters Patent of 1943"), has been graciously pleased to amend the Letters Patent bearing date the Tenth day of March, 1925, constituting the Office of Governor and Commander-in-Chief of the Colony of Cyprus and providing for the Government thereof as amended by Letters Patent bearing date the Twelfth day of November, 1931:

And whereas by the Letters Patent of 1943 it is directed and enjoined that the Letters Patent of 1943 shall be published in the *Cyprus Gazette* and shall come into operation on a day to be fixed by the Governor by Proclamation in the said *Gazette*:

Now, therefore, I, Charles Campbell Woolley, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Officer of the Most Excellent Order of the British Empire, upon whom has been conferred the Decoration of the Military Cross, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Cyprus, in exercise of the powers conferred by the Letters Patent of 1943, do hereby order and proclaim that the Letters Patent of 1943 shall come into operation on the 22nd day of April, 1943.

Given at Nicosia, this 22nd day of April, 1943.

No. 143. THE DEFENCE REGULATIONS, 1940 TO (No. 1) 1943.

★ ORDER MADE BY THE COMPETENT AUTHORITY UNDER REGULATION 61.

In exercise of the powers vested in me by virtue of my appointment by the Governor as the Competent Authority for the purposes of regulation 61 of the Defence Regulations, 1940 to (No. 1) 1943, I hereby order as follows:—

1. This Order may be cited as the Defence (Control of Raisins) Order, 1943.
2. In this Order—
"Raisins" means boiled or scalded raisins produced in Cyprus.
3. On or before the 6th May, 1943, every person who has in his possession or under his control any raisins in excess of 40 okes shall complete and deliver to me a return in the form set forth in the First Schedule hereto in respect of the raisins in his possession or under his control.
4. Not later than 6 days after the last day of each month, commencing from the month of May, 1943, every person who has in his possession or under his control any raisins in excess of the quantity stated in clause 3 of this Order shall complete and deliver to me a return of the raisins in his possession or under his control, in the form set forth in the Second Schedule hereto.
- 5.—(1) From and after the date of the publication of this Order in the *Gazette* no person who has in his possession or under his control any quantity of raisins in excess of the quantity mentioned in clause 3 of this Order shall make use of or shall sell or dispose of any raisins to any person except under a special permit issued under my hand.

(2) Every special permit issued under the provisions of sub-clause (1) hereof may contain such terms and conditions as may be specified therein.

6. Every person shall permit such person as I or the Commissioner may authorize in writing in that behalf, to enter upon and inspect his premises for the purpose of ascertaining whether the provisions of this Order have been or are being complied with, or for the purpose of checking the correctness or accuracy of any return made by such person under any of the provisions of this Order.

7. Any person who—

- (a) acts in contravention of, or fails to comply with any of the provisions of this Order; or
- (b) makes any return required to be made under this Order, which is false in any material particular; or
- (c) fails to comply with any term or condition contained in any special permit issued under this Order; or
- (d) knowingly misleads or otherwise interferes with or impedes any person exercising any powers or performing any duties under the provisions of this Order;

is liable to the penalties prescribed in regulation 94 of the Defence Regulations, 1940 to (No. 1) 1943.
