THE VILLAGE AUTHORITIES (FEES REGULATION) LAW, 1943.

ORDER IN COUNCIL No. 2080.

MADE UNDER SECTION 2.

C. C. WOOLLEY,
Governor.

I, the Governor in Council, in exercise of the powers conferred by section 2 of the Village Authorities (Fees Regulation) Law, 1943, do hereby order as follows:—

1. This Order may be cited as the Village Authorities (Fees Regulation) Order, 1943.

2. From and after the 1st day of June, 1943—

- (a) the fees set out in the second column of the First Schedule hereto shall be payable to, and shall be levied or received by, Mukhtars in lieu of the fees set out in the law set out in the first column of the said Schedule;
- (b) the fees set out in the second column of the Second Schedule hereto shall be payable to, and shall be levied or received by, Azas in lieu of the fees set out in the law set out in the first column of the said Schedule.

FIRST SCHEDULE.
FEES TO MUKHTARS.

Law	Fees
A.—The Births and Deaths Registration Laws, 1895 to 1937, section 6.	A.—Under section 6: where information concerning birth is given to the Registrar: (a) before the expiration of thirty-one days after the birth, a fee of 3 piastres; (b) after the expiration of thirty-one days after the birth, a fee of 6 piastres.
B.—The Immovable Property Registration and Valuation Laws, 1907 to 1942, section 41 (5) and Schedule 2.	B.—1. Under section 41 (5): upon certifying any signature, seal or mark, the sum of 1s.; 2. Under Schedule 2 (a) item (1):— upon issuing, signing and sealing a certificate of facts relating to the occupation or possession of immovable property:— (i) without inspection of the property, the sum of 1s.; (ii) where inspection of the property is necessary and has been made by the Mukhtar, the sum of 1s. together with payment in respect of the time occupied by the inspection at the rate of 5s. for a day, or 3s. for half a day or less; (b) item (2):— upon issuing, signing and sealing a certificate of facts relating to the death of any owner or occupier of immovable property or as to the heirs left by him, the sum of 1s. 4p.;

C.—Village Authorities Laws, 1931 to 1937. First Schedule, Part I.	<p>(c) item (3) :— upon preparing, signing and sealing a certificate of partition of immovable property assented to by the persons co-interested :—</p> <p>(i) where the Mukhtar has not attended the partition, the sum of 2s. with an additional charge of 2 piastres in respect of each piece of property divided in excess of nine pieces;</p> <p>(ii) where the Mukhtar has attended the partition, the sum of 2s. together with payment in respect of the time occupied by the inspection at the rate of 5s. for a day or 3s. for half a day or less;</p> <p>(d) item (4) :— all other certificates, the sum of 1s. 4½p.</p>
D.—Rural Constables Laws, 1932 to 1942. Section 8 (1), 27 (1) (b) and 29.	<p>C.—First Schedule (Part I) :—</p> <p>(a) item I : in the execution of any writ of execution on behalf of the Sheriff, where the total amount bid :—</p> <p>(i) does not exceed 10s., a fee of 1s. ;</p> <p>(ii) exceeds 10s., a fee at the rate of 5% on the amount bid, provided that the minimum fee shall be 1s. ;</p> <p>(b) item III :— for every certificate given under the provisions of the Cattle Certificate Law, 1889 :—</p> <p>(i) for each certificate for each bull, calf, camel, cow, donkey, gelding, heifer, horse, mare, mule, ox or steer, 1s. ;</p> <p>(ii) for each certificate for each ewe, goat, hog, kid, lamb, pig, sheep or sow, 2p. ;</p> <p>(iii) for each certificate after the first ten certificates given at the same transaction :—</p> <p>(1) in respect of any of the animals mentioned in paragraph (i) above, 4½p.</p> <p>(2) in respect of any of the animals mentioned in paragraph (ii) above, 1p.</p> <p>(c) item V :— on affixing his seal to any certificate relating to movable or immovable property, at the discretion of the Mukhtar, a fee not exceeding 2s. ;</p> <p>(d) item VI :— for reporting under the provisions of section 10 (j) the death of persons possessed of, or beneficially interested in, immovable property, etc., 1s. 4½p. payable out of the estate of the deceased;</p> <p>(e) item VII :— for every certificate on the back of every duplicate unmounted photograph accompanying an application for a passport and required to be certified under instructions issued by the Governor, a fee of 1s.</p>
E.—Elementary Education Laws, 1933 to (No. 2) 1937. Section 72 (1).	<p>D.—(a) Under section 8 (1) : the fee for the Mukhtar shall be calculated at the rate of 5% on the amount required for the purposes of section 5 (such fee not to exceed £5 in any one year) ;</p> <p>(b) under paragraph (b) of section 27 (1) : the fee payable by the claimant for the price of paper and writer's fee shall be 2s. ;</p> <p>(c) under section 29 (1) : the fee (to be retained by the Mukhtar) payable together with the amount due shall be 1½p. for every shilling of the amount due.</p> <p>E.—Under section 72 (1) : the fee payable to the Chairman of the Village Commission concerned shall be calculated at the rate of 5% on the amount required under sections 24 and 71 and appearing on the relevant notice (such fee not to exceed a total fee of £5 in any one year).</p>

B.—First Schedule (Part II): for every certificate on the back of every duplicate unmounted photograph accompanying an application for a passport and required to be certified under instructions issued by the Governor, a fee of 4½p.

THE RECOVERY OF COMPENSATION FOR INJURY TO PROPERTY
LAWS, 1930 TO 1937.

REGULATIONS MADE UNDER SECTION 21.

I, the Governor in Council, in exercise of the powers conferred by section 21 of the Recovery of Compensation for Injury to Property Laws, 1930 to 1937, do hereby make the following regulations:—

1. These regulations may be cited as the Recovery of Compensation for Injury to Property (Amendment) Regulations, 1943, and shall be read as one with the Recovery of Compensation for Injury to Property Regulations, 1931 and 1937, (hereinafter referred to as "the principal Regulations") and the principal Regulations and these regulations may together be cited as the Recovery of Compensation for Injury to Property Regulations, 1931 to 1943.
