ORDER MADE BY THE COMPETENT AUTHORITY UNDER REGULATION 61

In exercise of the powers vested in me by virtue of my appointment by the Governor as the Competent Authority for the purposes of regulation 61 of the Defence Regulations, 1940 to (No. 9) 1942, I hereby order

1. This Order may be cited as the Defence (Soap Control) (Amendment) Order, 1943, and shall be read as one with the (Soap Manufacturers Control) Order, 1942, (hereinafter referred to as "the principal Order"), and Supplement the principal Order and this Order may together be cited as the Defence No 3: (Soap Control) Orders, 1942 and 1943.

2. Clause 1 of the principal Order is hereby amended by the deletion therefrom of the word "Manufacturers".

3. Clause 2 of the principal Order is hereby revoked and the following clause substituted therefor:-

"2. In this Order-

'soap' means soap of all kinds and includes standard soap; 'soap manufacturer' means any person who owns or controls

any factory or premises wherein soap is manufactured;

standard soap 'means soap bearing the capital letter 'S' on the one side and the name of the manufacturer on the other, each piece weighing approximately 50 or 100 drams."

4. Clause 4 of the principal Order is hereby amended as follows:-(a) by the deletion from paragraph (b) thereof of the fullstop and

the substitution therefor of a semi-colon;

(b) by the addition thereto of the following paragraph:—

(c) issue standard soap to such persons as I or the Commissioner of the District may direct."

5. Clause 5 of the principal Order is hereby amended by the addition thereto of the words "except with my permission in writing previously obtained ".

6. The principal Order is hereby amended by the insertion imme-

diately after clause 5 thereof of the following clause:-

"5A. No person, other than a person to whom standard soap has been issued under my directions or under the directions of the Commissioner of the District, shall have in his possession or under his control any standard soap exceeding in weight in the aggregate five okes."

ORDER MADE BY THE COMPETENT AUTHORITY UNDER REGULATION 61.

In exercise of the powers vested in me by virtue of my appointment by the Governor as the Competent Authority for the purposes of regulation 61 of the Defence Regulations, 1940 to (No. 9) 1942, I hereby order as follows:—

1. This Order may be cited as the Defence (Control of Tree Felling) Order, 1943.

2. For the purposes of this Order "tree" means any standing tree, whether living or dead, of the following kinds, that is to say, Pine, Cypress, Cedar, Plane, Alder, Poplar, Eucalyptus, Oak (Dhrys), Walnut and Casuarina.

3. From and after the date of the publication of this Order in the Gazette no person shall fell, cut down or convert to timber any tree except under the authority of a licence from the Timber Controller or a Timber Control Officer:

Provided that nothing in this Order contained shall prohibit a person from lopping or pruning the side branches of any tree for the purpose

of providing firewood.

4. Any person wishing to obtain a licence under this Order shall apply to the Timber Controller or a Timber Control Officer in the form set out in the Schedule hereto giving the particulars therein contained.

5. A licence under this Order may be issued or refused at the discretion of the Timber Controller or the Timber Control Officer to whom application is made for the issue thereof and may contain such terms and conditions as the Timber Controller or the Timber Control Officer issuing the same may think fit to impose.

6. Any person who acts in contravention of, or fails to comply with any of the provisions of this Order or of any terms or conditions contained in any licence issued under this Order is liable to the penalties prescribed in regulation 94 of the Defence Regulations, 1940 to (No. 9) 1942.

In pursuance of the provisions of section 19 of the Irrigation Divisions (Villages) Law, 1938, the following rules made by the Committee of the Irrigation Division of Polis-Skoulli Tserepia, in the District of Paphos, are published in the Gazette. (M.P. 407/43.)

IRRIGATION DIVISION OF POLIS-SKOULLI TSEREPIA. Rules.

1. These rules may be cited as the Irrigation Division of Polis-Skoulli Tserepia Rules, 1942.

In these rules, unless the context otherwise requires—
 "Commissioner" means the Commissioner of the District of Paphos;

"Committee" means the Committee of the Irrigation Division;
"Irrigation Division" means the Irrigation Division of Polis-Skoulli Tserepia;
"Low" means the Trigation Division of Polis-Skoulli Tserepia;

- "Law" means the Irrigation Divisions (Villages) Law, 1938;
 "list" means the list of the names and residence of the proprietors and of the lands and extent thereof which are to be benefited or are capable of being benefited by the works prepared under the provisions of section 15 of the Law as finally settled under the provisions of section 16 of the Law; "works" means the irrigation works of the Irrigation Division.
- 3. The Committee shall hold office for a period of three years beginning on the 31st October, 1942. Thereafter the election of the Committee shall take place
