The Quarantine Law, 1932.

NOTIFICATION UNDER SECTION 4.

In exercise of the powers vested in him by section 4 of the Quarantine Law, 1932, or otherwise, His Excellency the Governor is pleased to declare and hereby declares that the local areas in the first column of the Schedule hereto are infected local areas and that all passengers and goods therefrom shall, as from the date hereof, be subject to the measures prescribed by the Quarantine Regulations, 1932 to 1936, with respect to the dangerous infectious diseases in the second column of the Schedule hereto.

The Notification No. 168, published in Supplement No. 3 to the *Gazette* of the 20th May, 1943, is hereby cancelled.

No. 250. THE DEFENCE REGULATIONS, 1940 TO (No. 1) 1943.

ORDER MADE BY THE COMPETENT AUTHORITY UNDER REGULATION 61.

In exercise of the powers vested in me by virtue of my appointment by the Governor as the Competent Authority for the purposes of regulation 61 of the Defence Regulations, 1940 to (No. 1) 1943, I hereby order as follows:—

1. This Order may be cited as the Defence (Returns of Stocks of Linseed) Order, 1943.
2. Not later than seven days after the publication of this Order in the *Gazette* any person who has in his possession or under his control any linseed in excess of 200 okes shall complete and deliver to me a return containing the particulars set forth in the First Schedule hereto.
3. Not later than six days after the last day of each month commencing from the month of August, 1943, every person who has in his possession or under his control any linseed in excess of the quantity mentioned in clause 2 of this Order shall complete and deliver to me a return of the linseed in his possession or under his control, in the form set forth in the Second Schedule hereto.
