THE DEFENCE REGULATIONS, 1940 TO (No. 1) 1943. No. 250.

ORDER MADE BY THE COMPETENT AUTHORITY UNDER REGULATION 61.

In exercise of the powers vested in me by virtue of my appointment by the Governor as the Competent Authority for the purposes of regulation 61 of the Defence Regulations, 1940 to (No. 1) 1943, I hereby order as follows:

1. This Order may be cited as the Defence (Returns of Stocks of Linseed) Order,

2. Not later than seven days after the publication of this Order in the Gazette any person who has in his possession or under his control any linseed in excess of 200 okes shall complete and deliver to me a return containing the particulars set forth in the First Schedule hereto.

3. Not later than six days after the last day of each month commencing from the month of August, 1943, every person who has in his possession or under his control any linseed in excess of the quantity mentioned in clause 2 of this Order shall complete and deliver to me a return of the linseed in his possession or under his control, in the form set forth in the Second Schedule hereto.

4.—(a) From and after the date of the publication of this Order in the Gazatte no person who has in his possession or under his control any quantity of linseed in excess of the quantity mentioned in clause 2 of this Order shall make use of, or shall sell or otherwise dispose of any linseed except to persons duly authorized under a special permit issued under my hand.

(b) Every special permit issued under the provisions of paragraph (a) hereof

may contain such terms and conditions as may be specified therein.

5. Every person shall permit such person as I or the Commissioner of the District may authorize by writing in that behalf, to enter upon and inspect his premises for the purpose of ascertaining whether the provisions of this Order have been or are being complied with or for the purpose of checking the correctness or accuracy of any return made by such person under any of the provisions of this Order.

6. Any person who-

- (a) contravenes or fails to comply with any of the provisions of this Order; (b) makes any return required to be made under the provisions of this Order which is false in any material particular;
- (c) fails to comply with any condition in any special permit issued under this Order;
- (d) knowingly misleads or otherwise interferes with or impedes any person exercising any powers or performing any duties under the provisions of this Order:

is liable to the penaltics prescribed in regulation 94 of the Defence Regulations, 1940 to (No. 1) 1943.
