No. 289. THE DEFENCE REGULATIONS, 1940 TO (No. 1) 1943.

ORDER MADE BY THE COMPETENT AUTHORITY UNDER REGULATION 61.

In exercise of the powers vested in me by virtue of my appointment by the Governor as the Competent Authority for the purposes of regulation 61 of the Defence Regulations, 1940 to (No. 1) 1943, I hereby order as follows:—

1. This Order may be cited as the Defence (Onion, Movement and Control) Order, 1943.

2. For the purposes of this Order—

“Local Purchases Officer” means any person or body of persons appointed under the Defence (Returns of Agricultural Produce) Order, 1943.

“Producer” means the owner or occupier of any land on which onions are or have been grown for the 1943 harvest.

3. Every producer in the districts of Limassol and Paphos shall on or before the 21st August, 1943, deliver to the Local Purchases Officer of the town or village in which the onions are or have been grown a signed declaration setting out the number of donums of onions grown by him for the 1943 harvest together with his expected production. Provided that this clause shall not apply to producers who have grown less than one-quarter of a donum. Where no Local Purchases Officer has been appointed the declarations should be delivered to the Mukhtar of the village in which the onions are or have been grown.

4. No producer shall sell, offer for sale, attempt to sell or make any arrangements to sell either directly or indirectly any onions save under a permit in writing given under my hand and subject to such conditions as may be contained in the permit.

5. No person shall move, transport or permit or suffer to be moved or transported any onions from the town or village in which they are grown to any other town or village save under a permit in writing given under my hand and subject to such conditions as may be contained in the permit.

6. Every person shall permit such person as I may authorize in writing in that behalf to enter and inspect his premises or property for the purpose of ascertaining whether the provisions of this Order have been or are being complied with or for the purpose of checking the correctness or accuracy of any declaration made by such person under the provisions of this Order.

7. Any person who—

(a) acts in contravention of, or fails to comply with, the provisions of this Order;

(b) makes, under the provisions of this Order, any declaration which is false in any material particular;

(c) fails to comply with any condition in any permit issued under the provisions of this Order;

(d) knowingly misleads or otherwise interferes with or impedes any person exercising any powers or performing any duties under this Order;

is liable to the penalties prescribed in regulation 94 of the Defence Regulations, 1940 to (No. 1) 1943.
