No. 359. THE DEFENCE REGULATIONS, 1940 TO (No. 1) 1943.

ORDER MADE BY THE COMPETENT AUTHORITY UNDER REGULATION 61.

In exercise of the powers vested in me by virtue of my appointment by the Governor as the Competent Authority for the purposes of regulation 61 of the Defence Regulations, 1940 to (No. 1) 1943, I hereby order as follows:—

1. This Order may be cited as the Defence (Returns of Stocks of Citrus Box Wood) Order, 1943.

2. In this Order—

“box” means a timber box or crate of the type normally used for the export of citrus fruit from Cyprus;

“box set” means collectively all pieces of timber used or capable and suitable for being used for the manufacture or construction of one box;

“box wood” means timber cut into pieces used or capable and suitable for being used in or for the manufacture, construction or completion of boxes or box sets and includes an incomplete box or box set.

3. Within seven days from the date of the publication of this Order in the *Gazette* every person who has in his possession or under his control—

(a) any boxes or box sets exceeding ten in number;

(b) any box wood in excess of the quantity required to manufacture or construct ten boxes or box sets;

(c) any pieces of box wood exceeding thirty in number;

shall complete and deliver to me at Nicosia, a return in the form of, and containing the particulars set out in, the Schedule hereto, in respect of such boxes, box sets or box wood in his possession or under his control.

4.—(1) From and after the date of the publication of this Order in the *Gazette* no person who has in his possession or under his control any boxes, box sets or box wood in excess of the quantity specified in clause 3 of this Order shall remove, make use of, sell, dispose of or deal with, such boxes, box sets or box wood, save under a permit issued under my hand or under the hand of any person authorized by me in writing in that behalf.

(2) Every permit issued under the provisions of sub-clause (1) of this clause may be general or in respect of any particular transaction and may contain such terms and conditions as may be specified therein.

5. Every person shall permit such person as I or the Commissioner of the District may authorize in writing in that behalf to enter upon and inspect his premises or property for the purpose of ascertaining whether the provisions of this Order have been or are being complied with, or for the purpose of checking the correctness or accuracy of any return made by such person under clause 3 of this Order.

6. Any person who—

(a) acts in contravention of, or fails to comply with, any of the provisions of this Order;

(b) makes, under the provisions of this Order, any return which is false in any material particular;

(c) makes any false statement in any application for a permit under this Order;

(d) fails to comply with any term or condition in any permit issued under this Order;

(e) knowingly misleads or otherwise interferes with or impedes any person exercising any powers or performing any duties under the provisions of this Order;

is liable to the penalties prescribed in regulation 94 of the Defence Regulations, 1940 to (No. 1) 1943.

7. The provisions of this Order shall be in addition to, and not in derogation of, the provisions of the Defence (Control of Timber) Orders, 1942 and 1943.

The Defence (Returns of Stocks of Citrus Box Wood) Order, 1943—(Clause 3).

RETURN OF STOCKS OF CITRUS BOXES, BOX SETS AND/OR BOX WOOD.

The Controller of Supplies, Nicosia.

This is my/our return for the stocks of citrus boxes, box sets and/or box wood in my/our possession or under my/our control:—

* For items 1 to 3, inclusive, the number of boxes and box sets shall be stated; for item 4 both the approximate number of cubic metres in the aggregate of the box wood and the number of pieces of box wood shall be stated.

No. 360. THE DEFENCE REGULATIONS, 1940 TO (No. 1) 1943.

ORDER MADE BY THE COMPETENT AUTHORITY UNDER REGULATION 61.

In exercise of the powers vested in me by virtue of my appointment by the Governor as the Competent Authority for the purposes of regulation 61 of the Defence Regulations, 1940 to (No. 1) 1943, I hereby order as follows:—

1. This Order may be cited as the Defence (Acquisition of Petroleum Products) (Excessive Quantities) (Amendment) Order, 1943, and shall be read as one with the Defence (Acquisition of Petroleum Products) (Excessive Quantities) Order, 1940, (hereinafter referred to as "the principal Order") and the principal Order and this Order may together be cited as the Defence (Acquisition of Petroleum Products) (Excessive Quantities) Orders, 1940 and 1943.

2. Clause 3 of the principal Order is hereby deleted and the following clause substituted therefor:—

"3. Save under the authority of a permit issued under the hand of the Commissioner of the District, no person shall have in his possession or under his control a quantity of any petroleum product in excess of the normal quantity required by him:

Provided that the provisions of this clause shall not apply to any petroleum product in the possession or under the control of any person carrying on the business of a dealer in such petroleum product in the ordinary course of such business."

3. Clause 4 of the principal Order is hereby amended by the deletion therefrom of the words "may be lawfully acquired by", which appear in line 4, and the substitution therefor of the words "may lawfully be in the possession or under the control of".
