No. 362. THE CUSTOMS LAWS, 1936 TO (No. 2) 1942.

I, the Governor in Council, in exercise of the powers conferred by section 6 of the Customs Laws, 1936 to (No. 2) 1942, do hereby order as follows:—

1. This Order may be cited as the Customs Houses (Days and Hours of Business) Order, 1943.

2. Subject to paragraph 3 of this Order all Customs Houses shall be open for the transaction of business on every day in the week as follows:—

From 1st June to 31st October in every year from 8 a.m. to noon and from 3 p.m. to 5 p.m.

From 1st November to 31st May in every year from 8 a.m. to noon and from 2 p.m. to 5 p.m.

3. All Customs Houses shall be closed for business on Sundays, Saturdays afternoon, Good Friday, Easter Monday, His Majesty's Birthday and Christmas Day.

4. Notwithstanding anything in this Order contained a Collector may give special permission for overtime work to be carried out by Customs Officers in the District in which he is appointed on any day at such rates as may be prescribed from time to time by the Comptroller for the services of such officers.

5. The Customs Houses (Days and Hours of Business) Order, 1939, is hereby revoked without prejudice to anything done or left undone thereunder.

No. 364. THE MUNICIPAL CORPORATIONS LAWS, 1930 TO 1943.

BYE-LAWS MADE BY THE COUNCIL OF THE MUNICIPAL CORPORATION OF LARNACA.

In exercise of the powers vested in them by the Municipal Corporations Laws, 1930 to 1943, and otherwise, the Council of the Municipal Corporation of Larnaca hereby make the following bye-laws:—

1. These bye-laws may be cited as the Municipal Corporation (Larnaca) (Amendment No. 2) Bye-laws, 1943, and shall be read as one with the Municipal Corporation (Larnaca) Bye-laws, 1931 to 1943 (hereinafter referred to as "the principal Bye-laws") and the principal Bye-laws and these bye-laws may together be cited as the Municipal Corporation (Larnaca) Bye-laws, 1931 to (No. 2) 1943.

2. The following bye-law shall be substituted for bye-law 27 (1) of the principal bye-laws:—

"27.—(1) The following tolls shall be paid by the owner or the person in charge of the following goods, marketable commodities and live-stock brought into or exposed for sale in the municipal market:—

(a) Goods other than fresh fish, meat or pork—	p.
(i) For every hand basket	1½
(ii) For every receptacle whether full or not—	
If not exceeding thirty okes gross	3
If not exceeding sixty okes gross	4½
If exceeding sixty okes gross, 4½p. plus 1p. for every ten okes or part thereof in excess of sixty okes.	
(b) Oil—	
(i) For every skin whether full or not	6
(ii) For every other receptacle whether full or not—	
If of a capacity not exceeding 15 okes	4½
If of a capacity exceeding 15 okes	9
(c) Lime or gypsum—	
For every load of sixty okes or part thereof	2
(d) Charcoal—	
For every load of sixty okes or part thereof	2
(e) Fuel—	
(i) For every one-horse cart load	6
(ii) For every two-horse cart load	12
(iii) For every lorry load	18
(iv) For every lighter load	45
(f) Flour—	
For every sack—	
If not exceeding thirty okes gross	2
If not exceeding sixty okes gross	3
If exceeding sixty okes gross, 3p. plus 1p. for every twenty okes or part thereof.	
(g) Live-stock—	
(i) For every ox or calf	6
(ii) For every sheep, goat, lamb, kid or swine	3."

3. The following bye-law shall be substituted for bye-law 28a (1) of the principal bye-laws:—

"28a.—(1) The following tolls shall be paid by the owner or the person in charge of the following perishable goods brought into or exposed for sale in the market of perishable goods:—

(a) For every hand basket	p.
(b) For every other receptacle whether full or not—	
If not exceeding thirty okes gross	3
If not exceeding sixty okes gross	4½
If exceeding sixty okes gross 4½p. plus 1p. for every ten okes or part thereof in excess of sixty okes.	
(c) For every hare or brace of partridges or of other wild birds of similar size, or for only one partridge or such bird	2.
(d) For beccaficoes or other birds of similar size, per dozen or fewer.. .. .	2."

No. 365. THE DEFENCE REGULATIONS, 1940 TO (No. 1) 1943.
