

No. 402. THE DEFENCE REGULATIONS, 1940 TO (No. 1) 1943.

ORDER MADE BY THE COMPETENT AUTHORITY UNDER REGULATION 61.

In exercise of the powers vested in me by virtue of my appointment by the Governor as Competent Authority for the purposes of regulation 61 of the Defence Regulations, 1940 to (No. 1) 1943, I hereby order as follows:—

1. This Order may be cited as the Defence (Quinine Control) Order, 1943.
2. In this Order, unless the context otherwise requires—
the expressions “chemist and druggist”, “Deputy Controller” and “medical practitioner” shall have respectively the same meaning as in clause 2 of the Defence (Medical Supplies) Order, 1943.
“quinine” means any quinine of the kind mentioned in the First Schedule to this Order.
3. Not later than six days after the last day of each month commencing from the month of November, 1943, every chemist and druggist and every registered importer who has in his possession or under his control any quinine shall complete and deliver to me a return containing the particulars set forth in the Second Schedule hereto in respect of his dealings in quinine.
4. From and after the publication of this Order in the *Gazette* no person shall supply or procure or offer to supply or procure any quinine to or for any person except—
 - (a) in pursuance of a prescription issued by a medical practitioner as in clause 6 of this Order provided; or
 - (b) in pursuance of a permit issued under my hand or the hand of a Deputy Controller or the hand of a Medical Supplies Control Officer; every such permit may contain such terms and conditions as may be specified therein (including the kind of quinine and the periods between which the quinine may be supplied or procured).
5. No person shall blend any quinine with any other drug, chemical, or any other substance whatsoever or cause or allow any quinine to be so blended save—
 - (a) in pursuance of a prescription issued by a medical practitioner as in clause 6 of this Order provided; or
 - (b) in pursuance of a permit issued under my hand or the hand of a Deputy Controller.
- 6.—(1) No medical practitioner shall prescribe any quinine save for persons suffering from malaria or as a sclerosing agent:
Provided that when a medical practitioner is of opinion that quinine is indispensable for the treatment of any patient for any other disease, such medical practitioner may make to me an application therefor, setting forth the name, address and age of the patient and the disease from which he is suffering.
 - (2) An application made under the proviso to sub-clause (1) hereof may be granted or refused at my discretion or granted upon such terms and conditions as I may deem fit to impose.
 - (3) Every prescription prescribing quinine shall be signed by the medical practitioner who issues the same and shall state the disease from which the patient is suffering.
 - (4) Every person executing a prescription prescribing quinine shall keep the same and shall on demand produce it to any inspector appointed under clause 7 of this Order.
7. I may appoint inspectors and any such inspector may enter upon any premises and make such enquiries or inspection of books and premises as may be necessary to ascertain—
 - (a) whether the provisions of this Order have been or are being complied with; or
 - (b) for the purpose of checking the correctness or accuracy of any return made by any person under the provisions of clause 3 of this Order.
8. The First Schedule hereto may be amended by me by Notice published in the *Gazette* and upon such publication such amendment shall form part of this Order for all purposes.
9. Any person who—
 - (a) acts in contravention—
 - (i) of any of the provisions of this Order; or
 - (ii) of any terms or conditions specified in any permit issued under this Order or imposed upon the grant of an application made under clause 6 of this Order; or
 - (b) knowingly makes in any application under the proviso to clause 6 of this Order a statement which is false in any material particular; or
 - (c) knowingly misleads or otherwise interferes with or impedes any person exercising any powers or performing any duties under the provisions of this Order,
 is liable to the penalties prescribed in Regulation 94 of the Defence Regulations, 1940 to (No. 1) 1943.
