A PROCLAMATION.

C. C. WOOLLEY,

Governor.

Whereas it is expedient that the village of Asinou, in the District of Nicosia, should be abolished.

Now, therefore, in exercise of the powers vested in me by the Village Authorities Laws, 1931 to (No. 2) 1937, and of every other power and authority enabling me in that behalf, I, Charles Campbell Woolley, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Officer of the Most Excellent Order of the British Empire, upon whom has been conferred the Decoration of the Military Cross, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Cyprus, do hereby proclaim that the village of Asinou in the District of Nicosia shall, for all administrative purposes, be abolished as from the 1st day of December, 1943, and that the whole of the present area of the said village shall be transferred to Nikitari village in the District of Nicosia and shall form one common area of the said village of Nikitari as from the said date.

Given at Nicosia, this 20th day of November, 1943.
